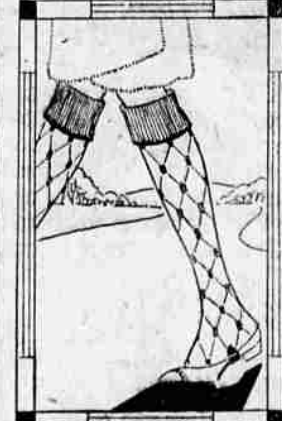
Helen Hutchinson is still confined to the house. She has had a very bad cold settling in her vocal chords leaving her unable to speak above a whisper.

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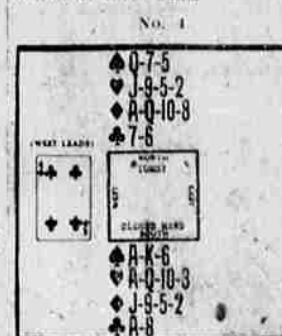
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Bridge Pointers

The following hand was given yesterday, it being the fourth and last of a series in which the question to be considered is which finesse declarer should try when he has the opportunity of finessing in two or three suits.



How should declarer plan to play the above hand?

THE ANSWER

There is no point in declarer's winning the first club trick, even if he did and every finesse worked successfully, he could not make a Grand Slam as having an equal number of cards in each suit in his two hands, there is nothing on which he could discard his losing club. The adverse nine clubs must be divided either 4-5 or 6-3 because the leader must have three clubs higher than the four and may have one, two or none lower. If West has both the Ten and Nine of Clubs, the division of the adverse Clubs is 6-3; if West has

put one or neither of these Clubs, Spades and then put Dummy in with the Queen (Declarer retaining command of the Spade suit by keeping the King); then he should try the finesse by leading the Heart Jack from Dummy. If East plays a small Heart, Closed Hand should play the Ten of Hearts so that, if the finesse wins, Declarer can lead the Nine of Hearts next from Dummy and, East still playing small, underplay it with the Right, thus getting three Heart finesses which will give him the requisite four Heart tricks.
