"Chang" Praised To Skies By Gotham Editor

It is not often that metropolitan editors stop to praise a motion picture. Therefore, the following editorial which appeared in The New York World a few days after Merian C. Cooper and Ernest R. Schoedack's Paramount production "Chang" (which by the way is opening a three day run at the Arcade theater today) had opened "should be of interest to film fans."

"To many of us the new moving picture 'Chang' will be worth more than a dozen super-productions which cost \$2,000,000. For this picture has one quality which most pictures lack, and that is reality. The trouble with the average movie, more than the relatively trivial questions of art, is the irritating artificiality that hangs over it; no matter how ingenious the story or how beautiful the photography, an intelligent person finds it hard to believe the events which transpire on the screen. But no such weakness inheres in this picture. You can no more doubt it than you can doubt your eyes. And this is because those who made it went straight to Nature for their materials."

"Like the picture 'Grass' in which Mr. Merian C. Cooper also had a hand, it deals with the struggle of primitive people against elemental things. In 'Grass' it was the impetuous journey of Asiatic nomads to follow the grass which fed their herds. In 'Chang' it is the dangerous battle of Siamese savages against the jungle. And this jungle with the leopards, monkeys, constrictors, bears, tigers and elephants which inhabit it, could not be faked. It had to be stalked honestly, patiently, and often at great hazard; and the result is one of the greatest photographic documents that has ever been made. Perhaps the greatest thrill of all is where a herd of elephants, numbering many scores, stampede into the camera's eye. What a feeling when the field goes dark and those great legs pound night over you."

"It is magnificent stuff. May the movie give us more like it." A new Boly Vernon Paramount comedy is also being shown.

"Mockery" Stars Lon Chaney At The Star

"Mockery," Lon Chaney's new starring vehicle for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, which plays at the Star theater Tuesday and Wednesday is a dramatic mystery play of the Russian revolution.

Chaney plays the role of a strange, heart-like peasant who worships a girl of the upper classes and is content to be her slave if only he can serve her. Then by a strange turn of fate, she is placed absolutely in his power. The bloodshed and horror of the revolution rages about them. The peasant becomes a leader and drunk with his power, he all but destroys the thing he had loved. Leatrice Joy Star in Film At Colonial

Proving itself a picture far above the average in point of interest, appeal and beauty, Leatrice Joy's new De Mille production, "The Angel of Broadway," was warmly greeted by local movie fans at the Colonial theater yesterday. Appearing in two distinct roles, one a night club dancer and the other a Salvation Army lassie, Miss Joy vested both with rare artistry. Victor Varconi, the patriotic Pilate of "King of Kings," was excellent as a husky truck driver opposite the dainty star.

There are many dramatic moments in this powerful story of New York's Great White Way and of the Salvation Army mission on the East Side. Babe Scott, a night club entertainer, puts on a new act, that of a Salvation Army girl who mingles with the revelers at the club. The picture abounds with drama, pathos and laughter. Altogether it is quite worth while. May Robson, Alice Lake, Jane Kenney, Tony Leidecker and Clarence Burton, rendered splendid support. Lois Weber the director, is entitled to praise for her efficient handling of a difficult picture theme. This charming production plays for the last time today.

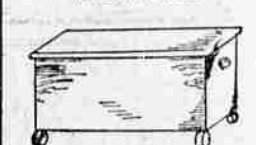

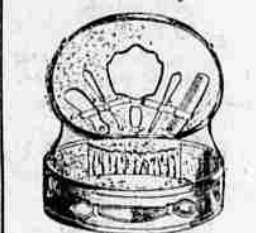

NEW YORK, Dec. 12. (AP)—A girl from Denver and a young man from Philadelphia today were looking forward to two years study of music and the spending of \$5000 each, first prizes in a national radio audition.

Evans, 22, bass baritone of West Philadelphia, Pa., last night were declared winners of the national contest as they sang into the microphone of WEAU and 22 associated stations to an estimated radio audience of thirty million persons. The prizes were awarded by the Atwater Kent Foundation.

Miss Enella De Prado, 26, of South San Francisco, Cal., lyric soprano and Ted A. Roy, 22, tenor of Corvallis, Ore., were winners of the second prizes of \$2000 in cash and one year's tuition in a conservatory of music.

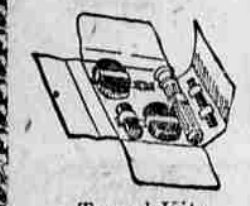
