### ALL GRADES EGGS ARE CENT LOWER

#### Turkey Receipts Light with Market Firm—Tariff on Prunes Revised

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13 (AP)—All grades of eggs quoted a cent lower on the Portland dairy exchange today except medium extras which are unchanged. Receipts are fairly heavy, while demand continues normal. Butter prices are firm.

Turkey receipts have been light during the past week and so far the market has held firm. Local wholesalers expect considerable increase in shipments within a few days with perhaps a slight strengthening in prices. Fancy turkeys have been moving mostly around 40 and 42 a pound, although a few very choice toms have brought as high as 45c. Other classes of poultry are steady.

Country dressed meats are steady with a slightly stronger tone prevailing in the veal division. Fancy veals are in fair demand at from 15c to 18c.

A downward revision in Germany's prune tariff, which will cut the duty on American prunes from \$1.05 to 45c per 100 pounds, is reported by cable from Berlin by American Agricultural Commissioner L. V. Steere. Whether prices in local market will be affected is problematical but an increase is looked for as export business increases.

### Price Recovery Features Wall Street Trading

NEW YORK, Dec. 13 (AP)—Stock prices made further recovery today. Industrials continued to lead the advance, gains in some of the high priced specialties running from 5 to nearly 10 points.

Steels responded to reports of improving trade conditions.

Violent fluctuations took place in Wright Aeronautical, which broke from an early high of 94 to 87 and rallied to around 92 by early afternoon. Curtis Airplane reached another new high. Among the scores or so other issues that reached new high ground were Montgomery Ward, Simmons, Calumet and Arizona, American Steel Foundries, Hupp Motor, Endicott Johnson, Brunswick Terminal, Fidelity-Phoenix Insurance, Continental Can and Transue and Williams.

St. Paul preferred and New Haven led the advance in the rails.

The closing was strong. Heavy buying of the metal shares featured late trading. International Nickel crossed 75, a new high for the year. U. S. Steel common was up nearly 3 points to 147 1/2 and American Metal, Calumet and Arizona and National Lead each advanced 4 points or more. Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.
