California's Era Of Spanish Rule Is Screened

The most romantic period in the history of California, the years just preceding the discovery of gold when the dons of Spain ruled the land and estates were measured in hundreds of miles, lives again in "Hose of the Golden West," the feature picture Thursday and Friday at the Star Theater.

"Chang," Marvel Movie, At Arcade Theater

"Chang" a motion picture revealing the hazardous life of the jungle has been brought back to America by Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack, who spent 22 months in the remote interior of Siam making the production.

Heralded by Paramount in such extravagant superlatives as "one of the greatest pictures of all time," "Chang" is utterly different from any photograph ever made. As the protagonists of man in his eternal fight to wrest a living from the wild, the producers chose an heroic Siamese family—a man, his wife, their two children, home-held pets and Bimbo the monkey.
