Regular Church Programs Sunday Are Promising

Stereopticon Slides to Be Shown at First M. E. Church; Dr. Shangle to Speak.

Sunday's church programs promise to be of unusual interest. Several special programs having been arranged for. In the evening at 7:30 o'clock the Junior Christian Endeavor society of the First Presbyterian church will present a Christmas program, and at the First Methodist church there will be a lantern slide lecture entitled "Giving Town and Country a Chance." Dr. H. S. Shangle will be the speaker in the evening at the Methodist Episcopal church south.

First M. E. Church
Fifty beautifully colored scenes will be shown on a screen at the First Methodist Episcopal church, and a lecture illustrating the development of town and country life. In addition to the slides, the hymns "I Think When I Read That Sweet Story of Old" will be illustrated. The audience joining in singing the song. The public is invited.

During the regular morning worship at 11 o'clock the pastor, the Rev. H. W. Parker, will speak on "Christian Adventure," and there will be a special devotion by the choir. The Epworth League will meet at 4:25 o'clock and the Bible school at 9:45.

KIDNAPER SEEKS MONEY FOR GIRL

Father Waits Until Morning with Cash to Pay for Return of Daughter

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 17 (AP)—A father and a mother, broken by the torture of hours of suspense, today offered "anything—anything at all" that would bring back 12-year-old Marjorie Parker, who was kidnapped Thursday from her school room in a Los Angeles junior high school.

That the price of the girl's return would be money was indicated in a telephone call received last night by the father, Perry M. Parker, medical examiner of a Los Angeles bank.

A hasty voice which purported to be that of the kidnaper of the child asked Parker over the telephone if he was "a Christian gentleman enough to pay money" if the child were brought home.

"The money will be thrown out of a window if my little girl is placed on the front porch," the father replied.

Waits With Money
The banker sat for hours last night in his darkened home with the money in his hand waiting in vain for the return of his child.

It was not until after hours of waiting that he held a few friends of the money he had received. Although he would be loath to concede his girl be declared he had little hope left.

In the hundreds of police officers of Southern California were engaged in what was described as one of the most searching man hunts in the history of Southern California. Newspapers and radio carried descriptions of the girl and the man who called her for at her school Thursday declaring he wished to take her to her father who had been injured in an accident.

Suspects have been taken into custody by the police for questioning, but such in fact has been released.

ALBANY, Ore., Dec. 17 (AP)—"Thousands of miles of way for a proposed railway line following mountainous country, has given land owners a chance of a railroad tapping the big timber areas beyond Powder and Sweetwaters."
