## HEALTH

**MATERNAL CARE AND MORTALITY**  
By Fred L. Adair, M. D., Minneapolis, Minn.

Member Georgia Memorial Maternity carries with it unnecessary risks to the expectant mother and of mothers during confinement and during the lying-in period. The major causes of death during maternity are infection and conditions, called toxemia, which are due to some obscure form of poisoning associated with pregnancy. Sickness and death from these and other causes cannot be absolutely prevented, but they can be greatly reduced by preventive measures and early detection of these danger conditions.

In order to reduce the occurrence of disease and death in connection with childbearing it is necessary to have prospective mothers seek good advice early, and then to receive proper care all during this period. This means that there must be a general and widespread understanding by them of the importance of seeking this advice, and that properly trained persons must be available to give this care. The education of large masses of people to ideas concerning their own welfare takes time and patience. The education of persons who must be trained to carry on health work in the different communities takes years of intensive work. After these persons have been properly trained and educated, there is the very important problem of distribution so that their services may be easily available to those who require them.
