Wheat Unsettled At Mart Opening

CHICAGO, Dec. 24 (AP)—Opening at 5c off to 1c up, Chicago wheat futures were a little better than the initial range. Corn started at 1/2c decline to an equal advance and subsequently underwent a moderate general setback. Oats followed corn. Provisions tended to sag.

STOCK MARKET BULLISH

NEW YORK, Dec. 24 (AP)—The "Christmas spirit" was reflected in the broad upward movement of prices on the New York stock exchange today.

Operators for the advance, radiating cheer regarding 1928 business prospects, bid up more than a score issues to record high prices. Trading was unusually heavy for a pre-holiday season. The days sales running around the quarter million shares.

U. S. Steel touched a new high on the movement at 155 and then ran into considerable profit taking, backing down to below 154. General Motors continued to forge upward, with the rise accelerated by active short coverings. The closing was firm.

BANK IS BOMBED

NEW YORK, Dec. 24 (AP)—The National City bank of New York today received a cable dispatch from Buenos Aires stating a bomb had been exploded outside its branch bank there this morning and adding that another bomb had been exploded in front of a branch of the First National bank of Boston. The dispatch contained no details.

BIRMINGHAM, Dec. 24 (AP)—A bomb exploded at the Tennessean branch building of the National City bank of New York today. Several persons were injured.

Yesterday afternoon at the church and last evening the intermediate endeavor society held a similar party at the church. Gifts and bags of Christmas candy and nuts are ready to be distributed among the children, and at 12 o'clock tomorrow hundreds of children will

gather at the intersection of Depot street and Washington avenue to receive the gifts.

To See Mattinee

On Monday morning at 10 o'clock the children will be the guests of Meyers and Bowen, proprietors of the Star and Arcade theaters, at a matinee which will be given at the Star.

On Monday evening the Salvation Army will have a program and Christmas tree for the members of the Sunday school and all needy children of the city.

On Christmas Monday afternoon from two until six o'clock the annual holiday celebration will be held at Hot Lake sanatorium. The afternoon's program will include vocal selections by Ames Black Hunt and Earle Denham, of Baker and Holent Stearns of Union, and violin selections by Miss Bertha Bantz.

At various times during the afternoon will appear and sing Christmas carols and give English folk dances.

whose fortunes took a turn for the better because of timely aid extended at Christmas are on record here.

The American Junior Red Cross, mindful of the children of other lands, has shipped more than 60,000 boxes of toys and clothing and other gifts—products of school workshops—abroad for this Christmas.

The Salvation Army will distribute more than 15,000 baskets of food to the needy, more than a third of them in the tenement districts of New York.

Several million dollars will be obtained to combat tuberculosis through the sale of Christmas seals. Last year the National Tuberculosis association reported sales totaling \$5,109,824.62.

Charities of commerce, churches, social agencies, welfare missions, police relief associations, community clubs, sources of other organizations and numerous individuals have bent their efforts to make this Christmas season one of universal good cheer.

On the outskirts of civilization—wherever may be found a little band of Christians—Christmas will be celebrated. Lonely workers in Alaska, the far east and the tucked away islands of the Pacific, will make some effort to capture the spirit of the season.

The government, weightily impersonal the rest of the year, unbends and shows its human side on Christmas day. Approximately 150,000 pounds of turkeys will be paid for by Uncle Sam so that his sea and land soldiers may celebrate in traditional fashion. Thousands of postal employees will leave their crowded working quarters and spend at least part of the day with their families.

Everywhere the spirit of Christmas permeates.
