Bedford Eating House Robbery Suspects Taken

MEMPHIS, Dec. 27 (AP).—After the Diamond Cafe on East Fifth street had been robbed of \$200 yesterday afternoon, Donald Jackson and Robert White, suspects, both 25 years of age, are apprehended several hours later on the Pacific highway by DeKalb county officers the other side of Grants Pass on suspects' list, approximately \$155, the amount taken from the cafe, in their possession. The car that the men were driving is said to have been stolen in Bakersfield, Calif.
