DOUBLE TEST OF WARNER TACTICS

Stanford and Pittsburg Coached By Master and Pupil, Respectively

PASADENA, Cal. (AP)—Two teams trained in the same school of football just for East-West supremacy here January 2 to the annual Tournament of Roses game.

The 1928 encounter across the Pittsburg University football field, "Pop" Warner, head coach, against the Stanford Cardinal, Warner's present protégé. It will oppose the strategy of the master against that of the pupil for Jack Rutherford, grid mentor of the eastern institution, was a star player under Warner when the latter still was coach at Pittsburg.

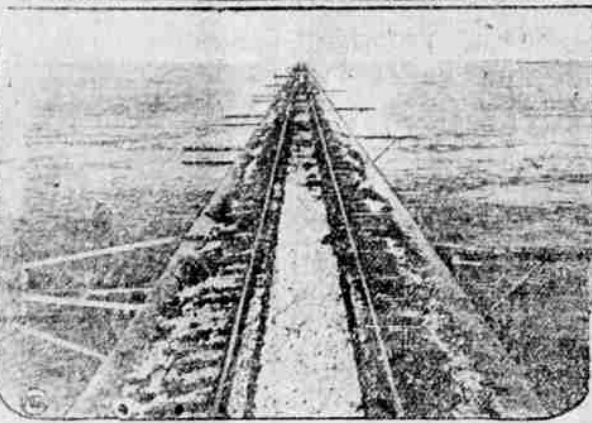
Pittsburg finished through the 127 games for eight seasons to defeat and score 46 touchdowns and a total of 279 points against 28 of its opponents. Stanford, 1928 Pacific Coast Conference champion and tied for the title again this year, has a record that is less impressive. It was defeated by seven-conference teams, St. Mary's College and Santa Clara university, and was held to a tie by Southern California, but the season record stands at seven wins, two defeats and the open tie, with a total of 144 points for Stanford to 63 for the opponents.

Pittsburg's fast and aggressive attack is built around one of the greatest halfbacks ever developed there — "Giddy" Welen, whose stunning play put him on virtually every all-American eleven picked this season. Jimmy Hagan, running mate to Welen, and Booth, fullback, complete the halfback threat that sends the Panthers through to a brilliant record dear of defeats and with only one loss that with Washington a defeat. To uphold Western honors Stanford will have a team slightly lighter in average pounds but one thoroughly drilled in all the trickery of a master strategist.

Stanford's line is bolstered by Captain Hal McCreary, at center and Memphis Post, guard, the latter being chosen by many authorities for the year's all-coast squad. A three-deep backfield, headed by "Biff" Hoffman, line cracker, fullback and "Tricky Dick" Hyland, halfback, provided the impetus for Stanford's offensive that bowled over two of the best coast teams to give the 1928 champions a claim on the 1927 title. Hyland is rated one of the finest football players in the country and runs the hundred in 12 seconds.

It will be Pittsburg's second clash with Stanford. In 1922 Warner brought his Panthers out west and trounced the team he now coaches by a 16 to 7 score. Now "Pop's" endeavor will be to reverse that victory.

New Question Is Raised By U. P. Concerning Tax

SALVEM, Ore., Dec. 28 (AP)—Attorneys for the Union Pacific railroad have raised a new question relative to taxes. It involves the legality of school budgets of several districts along the Columbia river in Oregon.

Taking The Dalles school district as a typical case, C. A. Howard has submitted it to Attorney General Van Alinker for an opinion. The Dalles school budget was voted on and adopted by the people last October. This budget was prepared by the school board and the budget committee for the school year 1928-1929 and they advertised it prior to the election.

The railroad attorneys maintain that the people should not have voted on the 1928-1929 budget at that early date and claim it should have been for the school year 1927-1928.

The question is important for the reason that at the beginning of the school district fiscal year in June, this year, The Dalles district had several thousand dollars on hand as an unexpended balance. The Union Pacific attorneys maintain that if the budget voted on in October was for 1927-1928 this balance should have been included in the initial estimated receipts. On the other hand it is claimed, if the budget was for 1928-1929 the estimated unexpended balance at the end of the current year would

Coolidge Signs Walsh's Measure

WASHINGTON, Dec. 28 (AP)—President Coolidge has signed the bill sponsored by Senator Walsh, Democrat, Montana, which will permit M. T. Everhart, son-in-law of Albert B. Fall, to testify in the Teapot Dome conspiracy case without incriminating himself.

The measure decreases the statute of limitations in government fraud cases from six to three years and opens the way for what the president in his conspiracy trial of Harry F. Sinclair and Fall, considered important evidence that Everhart declined to give previously on the ground that this testimony might incriminate him.

The acts regarding which Everhart was asked to testify occurred less than six years ago. With the disability removed Fall's son-in-law can now give a jury the information which he declined before to disclose.
