Farm Bureau Federation Urges Crop Pay Own Surplus Removal

By Chester H. Gray

Washington Representative American Farm Bureau Federation. WASHINGTON.—Any aspect of surplus removal or of arbitrary government price fixing will continue to be opposed by the American Farm Bureau Federation in its right to obtain surplus control legislation during the seventh congress. It might from some points of view be advantageous to get a direct subsidy from the federal treasury to reimburse agricultural loans and it might also temporarily be helpful to have prices actually set by national legislation, but the farm relief legislation which is being advocated is not of a temporary or emergency nature, but is designed to be of such nature as will mark the beginning of a definite national policy in agricultural affairs. A fundamental feature of such

surplus control legislation, it has been agreed that the administrative machinery should be simplified so that the board will not be so handicapped in its administrative work.

The size of the revolving fund is somewhat immaterial, provided it does not reach unusual amounts, when it is realized that this fund is safeguarded and protected by a supporting fund which accrues from the commodity being served by the board. A portion of the revolving fund should be used for loans to cooperative associations to promote their regular functions of handling farm crops, and furthermore to enable them more adequately to equip themselves with facilities and credit corporations steadily necessary to a successful handling of farm crops.

The farm relief legislation in the seventh congress will then, in brief, follow the main lines of the bills which received the approval of the sixty-ninth congress, and will be changed only in regard to refining and improving certain features which are in the nature of details.
