New Year's Will
Be Observed In
Church Services

Day Will Mark Beginning
of New Year for Several
Churches; Annual
Meeting Scheduled.

New Year's will be observed in the churches of the city Sunday—New Year's Day—and New Year's messages will be given by many of the pastors. In several of the churches the day will mark the beginning of a new year and for one—the Central Christian—the annual meeting will be held on that day.

In the afternoon and in the evening musical programs will be given, which are creating more than a little interest. The afternoon program will be a Christmas cantata at the Latter Day Saints tabernacle and the evening program will be given by the vested choir of the First Presbyterian church, which is directed by Mrs. A. L. Richardson. Both programs are given in detail in another article on this page.

Central Christian Church
The Central Christian church will have its annual meeting Sunday afternoon at the church, following a basket dinner at noon of which the Loyal Sisters will have charge. During the morning service at 11 o'clock the pastor will give his annual message and the subject will be "Going Forward." The Bible school will meet at 9:45 o'clock.

At the business meeting in the afternoon all matters of interest to the local church will be considered, reports will be given by each department and new officers will be elected. All members of the church are expected to be present.

The Junior, Intermediate, Young People's and Senior Christian Endeavor societies meet at 6:30 o'clock in the afternoon at 7:30 o'clock in the evening at 7:30 o'clock. There will be a song service led by the orchestra and the pastor, the Rev. R. L. Putnam, will give a New Year's sermon entitled "The Art of Beginning Anew."

First Methodist Episcopal Church
There will be a "College Night Service" Sunday evening at the First Methodist Episcopal church, which was arranged especially for the young people of the church who are home from college for the holidays.

The meeting of the Epworth League at 7 o'clock will merge into the evening service and at that time the officers of the league for the new year will be installed. In addition to the installation there will be talks and musical selections, both vocal and instrumental. An invitation is extended to the public to attend.

In the morning the church school will meet at 9:45 o'clock, with class for all ages. During the 11 o'clock worship hour there will be appropriate music for New Year's day and the pastor, the Rev. H. W. Parker will speak on "Stewardship and Declaration." A New Year's address.

The Presbyterian Church
The Rev. J. George Watz, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, will bring a New Year's message Sunday morning during the 11 o'clock hour of worship at that church. The Bible school will meet at 9:45 o'clock in the morning, the Junior Christian Endeavor society will meet at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and the Intermediate, Senior and Young People's Christian Endeavor at 6:30.

At 7:30 in the evening the choir, with Miss Edith Maguire at the console, will offer its first sacred concert, consisting of anthems, octets, sextets and solos.

Episcopal Church
"The New Year" will be the sermon subject Sunday morning at 11 o'clock at St. Peter's Episcopal church and will be given by the Rev. Oliver Riley, pastor of the church. During this hour there will be a choral celebration of the Holy Communion.
