Treasury To Retire More Liberty Bonds

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 (AP)—The treasury department is working on plans for the retirement of the third liberty bond issue maturing next September 15. Although they are still in a primary stage they provide for an exchange of the third liberty bonds for the quarterly issue of treasury bonds or certificates to be offered March 15 and it was said at the department today that it hopes to retire the \$2,147,832,150 of the 4 1/2% issue without disturbing the business and monetary systems.

Reaction Hits Stock Exchange; Trade Is Heavy

NEW YORK, Jan. 5 (AP)—A sweeping reaction followed by a partial recovery took place in today's stock market. Early selling large increase in stock exchange was based on the unexpectedly large increase in stock exchange member lots with the subsequent recovery in the reduction of call money rates from 4 1/2 to 4 per cent as against an opening rate of five and a half yesterday. Trading was in tremendous volume, the ticker falling nearly half an hour behind the market.

Spectacular declines took place in some of the recently strong specialties. Midland Steel products Preferred broke 28 points to 22 and rallied to 26 by early afternoon. Green Canada Copper collapsed 15 1/2 points to 123 and snapped back above 135. International Harvester, Union Carbide, Brooklyn Edison, Otis Elevator, Air Reduction and Collins and Aikman tumbled 5 to 6 points.

The closing was unsettled. New buying attracted by the volume of the decline in the standard industrial and resumption of pool operations in a handful of specialties, principally Westinghouse, Air Brake, Jones Bros., Tea International Cement, Centimeter Products and International Match Preferred, caused prices to mend fast in late dealings. Fresh offerings, however, of United States Steel, General Motors and other shares sensitive to professional pressure caused feverishness in the final hour. Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.

Wheat Heavy and Lower at Close

CHICAGO, Jan. 5 (AP)—Opening at 1 1/2 to 3c advance, Chicago wheat held near to the initial range. Corn and oats also were firmer, corn starting 1/4 to 1/2c up and subsequently showing further gains. Provisions tending to sag. Wheat closed heavy, 1/2 to 1 1/2c lower, corn 1/4 to 1/2c off, oats 1/4 to 1/2c down, and provisions showing 2 to 12c decline.
