# News of the Churches

## Young People To Participate In Sunday Services

## Epiphany Pageant Will Be Presented at St. Peter's Episcopal Church Tomorrow Evening

The young people will have an active part in Sunday's church program in La Grande. At St. Peter's Episcopal church the young people will give an Epiphany pageant, "The Transfiguration of the Gifts" in the evening during the regular church service hour, and at the English Lutheran church the Luther League will have its annual meeting at seven o'clock, when officers for the ensuing year will be elected and other matters of importance decided upon. The senior Christian Endeavor society will meet and organize at the Central Christian church, and the Epworth League of the First Methodist church will begin the study of E. Stanley Jones' book "The Christ of the Indian Road" which will continue for the next five weeks.

**St. Peter's Episcopal Church**  
About 15 young people will take part in the pageant "The Transfiguration of the Gifts" which will be given at St. Peter's Episcopal church tomorrow evening at 7:30 o'clock. The pageant is under the direction of the Rev. Oliver Riley. The day's worship at the Episcopal church will begin with the Holy Eucharist at eight o'clock in the morning followed by church school at 9:45 and the morning prayer and sermon at 11 o'clock. The subject on which the Rev. Oliver Riley, rector of the church, will speak will be "The Unknown Presence."

**English Lutheran Church**  
The Rev. Leif H. Axnes, pastor of the English Lutheran church, will speak during the church school hour tomorrow morning at 9:45 o'clock. His subject will be "The Lesson of the Compass." During the morning church services at 11 o'clock the pastor will speak on the subject "What Shall the Church do to be Saved?"

The annual meeting of the Luther League will be held in the evening, beginning at seven o'clock. Officers will be elected for the ensuing year at that time and other important matters will be discussed and decided upon. The meeting will open with a consideration of the topic "What Prayer Can Accomplish."

**Central Christian Church**  
The day's worship at the Central Christian church tomorrow will start with Sunday school at 9:45 o'clock in the morning, when

music will be furnished by the church orchestra. The morning church service is at 10 o'clock and the pastor will speak on the subject "Our Pre-Easter Campaign." The junior, intermediate, young people's and senior Christian Endeavor societies will meet at 6:30 o'clock in the evening, when the senior group will organize. Dr. J. L. McPherson is the leader.

The Epworth League will meet in the church parlors at 6:30 o'clock. The first program for the book "The Christ of the Indian Road" by E. Stanley Jones will be given. The study of the book will continue for five weeks.

In the evening at 7:30 o'clock the pastor will speak of "A Beautiful Picture" which will center around the most fascinating story of the New Testament scripture. There will also be special music during the evening service.

**First Presbyterian Church**  
At 11 o'clock tomorrow morning at the First Presbyterian church the pastor, the Rev. J. will be heard, in addition to other special music.

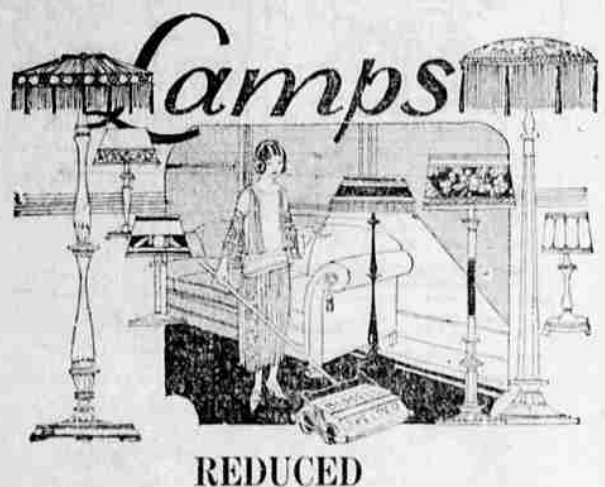

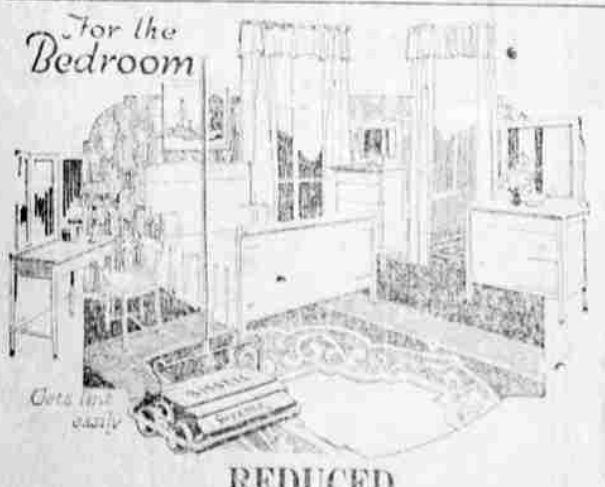

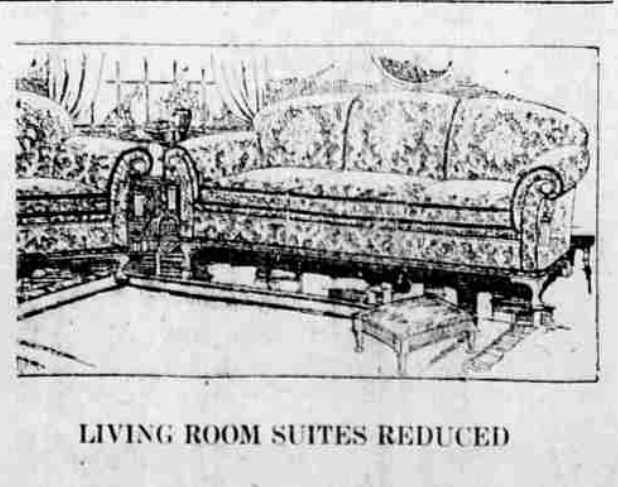
