Baker Quintet Defeats Weiser With Ease, 25-10

BAKER, Ore., Jan. 9 (Special) — Weiser took the short end of a 25 to 10 score in a speedy basketball game with the Baker hoop squad Saturday night in the local high school gymnasium. Baker held the lead throughout the game, showing more aggression in moving the ball into scoring range and trying more shots at the opponents' basket than the Idaho boys. Both teams were cautious until the half when Baker led 7 to 3. In the last period the players increased their speed to a point seldom reached this early in the season. Baker has four veterans in Landreth, Shine Mack, Hines and Tom Duff. Jones played some last year and showed up well last night. Carson, who played part of the second half for Mack, shows promise. Altogether, the Baker squad looks like a winner this season. Landreth was high point man with 11 points.

Walsh Will Use All Methods To Assemble Data

KANSAS CITY, Jan. 9 (AP) — The state has waived statutes governing the admission of evidence in California courts to permit a thorough examination of William Edward Hickman at his sanity hearing Jan. 25, Jerome Walsh, of defense counsel, announced today. The young Kansas City attorney who returned last night to collect evidence and summon witnesses from this section, exhibited a document signed by Asa Keyes, district attorney at Los Angeles, agreeing the defense could assemble data in any way possible. Walsh denied reports he had formally demanded a purported second confession by the confessed slayer of Marion Parker, which it was said, had been withheld by the state. "Hickman told me he did the whole thing," Walsh said, "and I believe he told the truth. I do not believe the purported second confession exists." Walsh said the prosecutor extended him every possible courtesy. Walsh announced Mrs. Eva Hickman would be summoned from her home here as one of the principal witnesses for her son. He said he did not plan to call the youth's sister. J. P. Costello, deputy district attorney, accompanied Walsh in Kansas City. He plans to collect evidence from Hickman's former associates here and in other southwest states.

Seek Civilized Trial

He declared that the state and the defense were united in the desire to "assure the world Hickman will have a civilized trial." Walsh said the prosecutor extended him every possible courtesy. Britain's Cider Independence May Impair America's Apple Revenue

BRISTOL, Eng., (AP) — Determined to make herself an independent cider-producing country, England is planting new orchards and reviving old ones. The result may have a depressive influence on American apple exports. Professor Barker, director of the National Cider Research station at Long Ashton, says "it is absurd to send abroad large sums of money to buy thousands of tons of cider fruit and millions of gallons of cider." Due somewhat to the limitation in quantity of beer produced during the war and the depreciation of its quality, cider has gained popularity as a beverage in England. The public has been seeking a substitute, too, for light wines and cider accordingly has shown a great improvement in quality. For the better part of 100 years, Professor Barker explains, comparative little planting of new orchards has been done. For the most part crops come from orchards nearing the end of their natural life. He says it will take 25 years for new orchards to count as a factor in cider production. A conference of experts, reviewing thousands of cider types, has reduced selection to 30 or 40 species. Farmers and big manufacturers are showing a definite interest in orchard establishment.

No More Flood Waters Strike City of London

LONDON, Jan. 9 (AP) — As tides ebbed and flowed without recurrence of the disaster, London today dared to hope the anger of the Thames had subsided. The French are proud of the fact that they have the Eiffel Tower, the highest structure in the world; the Garabit viaduct, the biggest metal viaduct; L'Ecluse, 42,000 tons, the biggest steamer built since the war; the Saint Pierre du Vauvray bridge, the biggest reinforced concrete bridge; the fastest electric train, running from Paris to Vierzonville; Le Bourget, the biggest airfield; the biggest aviation hangars, at Orly; the Canal de Roye, the biggest underground canal; the billion candle power searchlight at Mont Valerien and the 50,000-kilowatt alternating current generators at Gennevilliers. A frugal postmaster in California sent Postmaster-General Now a ball of twine, eighteen inches high and five feet in circumference, and weighing 2 1/2 pounds. The twine had been salvaged from letters and packages sent to his office during 1926. 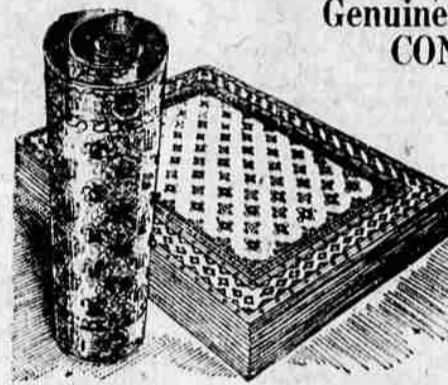
