Sharkey Again Enters Ring In Quest of Title

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 (AP)—Maklor his first ring start since being knocked horizontal by Jack Dempsey, last summer, Jack Sharkey resumes his heavyweight title pursuit tonight in a 12-round bout against Tom Honey, of New Zealand, in Madison Square Garden. The ex-gambler from Boston is a favorite although many boxing followers are cautiously withholding opinions. Sharkey is expected to be the choice by 25 to 1 when he steps into the arena at 10 o'clock for the prospect of punching his way into a championship affair with Gene Tunney. Tex Rickard hopes to match the winner against Tunney but he has announced that his decision will depend on the showing of the battlers. Dempsey's reputation for "running" his opponents has created doubt as to what showing may be expected from Sharkey. Terrific body punches which the Bostonian absorbed from Dempsey continue in the discussion. Physicians said that Sharkey was in fine condition, even better than when he fared Jim Maloney and Dempsey. To outward appearance, he was not harmed permanently in his elash with the Magnesia Mauler. Among Sharkey's accomplishments are victories over Harry Wills, George Godfrey and Maloney. Honey's records includes two encounters with Paulino Uzcudun, one of which was in the Spaniard's favor while the other was a draw; both decisions were unpopular. Honey has a victory over Johnny Rikho to his credit, however, and also conquered Paulino. With a top price of \$22 per ticket, indications were for a capacity crowd of 15,000.

Olympic Sports Draw Thousands To Switzerland

ST. MORITZ, Switzerland (AP)—Accommodations for 6,000 visitors have been arranged in the 45 hotels of St. Moritz and the neighboring health resort, St. Moritzbad, during the Olympic Winter Games from February 11 to 19. Many hotels which ordinarily do not open to winter business will be opened on account of the unprecedented number of tourists expected to be attracted by the international games, which last year were held at Chamonix, France, in 1924. M. C. Nater, syndic or mayor, of St. Moritz, who heads the local committee, has been advised that 600 athletes will compete in the various events. This does not include trainers and managers. The winter sports season is at its height in St. Moritz in February, and normally there are 3,000 visitors here during that month. The meet will open on February 11 with hockey matches in both morning and afternoon, and there will also be hockey on February 12, 13, 14, 15 and 19. The finals will be on the nineteenth. There will be horse racing on the ice on Lake St. Moritz on February 12 and a military ski team race.

State Alienists Examine Hickman This Friday, 13th

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 12 (AP)—Supposition it believed in by William Edward Hickman, might well include the jail cell of the confessed kidnaper and slayer today. With a top price of \$22 per ticket, indications were for a capacity crowd of 15,000. The defense expert witnesses, Dr. R. O. Shelton, and Dr. E. M. Pettis, virtually completed their examination of Hickman yesterday and in their preliminary report to his attorney, Richard Cantillon, branded the prisoner "wildly insane."
