Auto Fees Run Higher in 1928 Gain of \$580,000 Already Registered—91,356 Cars Visited State in 1927. SALEM, Ore., Jan. 11 (AP)— During 1927 a total of 91,356 automobiles from other states registered in Oregon. Of these 49,625 were from California, 18,787 from Washington, 5780 from Idaho and 447 from Nevada. Canadian cars numbered 1460. From Colorado there were 1241, from Illinois 1020, from Montana 1198 and from Utah 1005. Registrations were mainly at the stations in the southern part of the state. At Ashland they numbered 19,299, at Medford 14,529, at Grants Pass 12,002 and at Klamath Falls 4016. A statement by Secretary of State Komer shows that in including Jan. 12, this year, \$2,965,000 has been collected in automobile license fees as against \$2,412,000 on the corresponding date last year, a gain this year of \$580,000.
