A SEASONABLE RECIPE

Ham Loaf
2 lbs. lean pork
1 lb. raw, lean, smoked ham
1 cup cracker crumbs
3/4 teaspoon black pepper
1 handful raw oatmeal
2 well beaten eggs
1 cup milk
1 cup tomato sauce or soup
Grind the meat twice. Mix for meat loaf. Bake one hour. Slice, clove in loaf. Cover with tomato. Bake 1/2 hour longer.
