

DECLINES IN EGG PRICES EXPECTED

Quotations in Portland Produce Markets Firm as Week Begins

Portland, Ore., Jan. 23 (AP)—Prices on local produce markets were firm at the opening today with little holdover stock on hand and demand good for all classes of country dressed meats and poultry.

Dealers look for further slight declines in egg prices during the next few weeks but no decided drops are anticipated until receipts increase materially.

Poultry and meat prices will continue firm, dealers think, unless unexpectedly heavy shipments are received. Supply and demand have been balanced during the past few days and little change is anticipated.

Potatoes continue to move in fairly good volume at a wide range of prices, with top offerings of bakers bringing around \$2.25.
