

### New Projector Shows Slides In Broad Daylight

URBANA, Ill. (AP)—A machine that will project stereopticon slides in broad daylight has been perfected by Dr. T. T. Quicke of the department of geology of the University of Illinois.

The machine is complete in itself. No screen is needed and the teacher may operate it as he lectures.

Dissatisfied with the difficulty of providing visual education lectures, requiring the creation of a screen in the classroom and an assistant to operate the machine, Dr. Quicke hit upon the idea for his daylight projector in 1922.

He has perfected the machine since then and three of the projectors are now in use in classrooms here.

A wooden cabinet 50 inches high and 22 inches wide houses the projection machine. A series of mirrors reflect the view shown on the slide from one side to another, finally casting it from the interior on a glass screen built into the cabinet.
