Jackie Coogan's Latest Role Is Bell Boy

Jackie Coogan's last role on the
screen was largely a matter of
fastening and unfastening buttons.
He estimated that he manipulated
button and buttonhole at least 192
times a day during the filming of
"Button", his new Metro-Goldwyn-
Mayer starring vehicle playing at
the Star theater Sunday and Mon-
day. And all this was just inci-
dental to his acting his role, be-
ing rescued from a shipwreck, in-
cluding in a fight, being locked in
a dozen other adventures on the
high seas.

In the new picture Jackie plays
a bellboy on a great ocean liner.
His uniform, the standard page's
uniform in the British Merchant
Marine, had a tight fitting jacket
with sixteen brass buttons on it.

To put on and take off this
jacket meant fastening and un-
fastening buttons thirty-two times
—and Jackie put it on and took
it off an average of six times a
day—hence a total of one hundred
ninety-two buttons.

The new picture is a vivid story
of modern life on the sea, in a
great floating hotel, where despite
all the aids of modern science
there is still high adventure to be
had. Lars Hanson plays the cap-
tain of the liner and Gertrude
Olmstead the heroine of the play,
with Roy D'Arcy, Pally Moran,
Coy Watson, Jr., Paul Hurst, Jack
McDonald and others of note in
the cast.

Much of the picture was taken
aboard a big liner, and elaborate
sets to duplicate its interior were
constructed at the studios. The
wreck was staged on a sensational
scale, and other details of note are
the fight in the "glory hole" and
other thrills blended with a human
heart interest story containing a
deal of comedy.
