PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 6—With the Pacific coast conference basketball race about half over, two teams in the north—Washington and O. A. C.—and two in the south—Southern California and Southern Branch—seem to have the inside track for the sectional titles.

Washington has a slight lead in the north over the Aggies. The Huskies having won five conference games, while the Aggies have won three and lost only one. The Huskies and the Aggies both hold victories over the champion Oregon quintet, both of these games having been played at Eugene, and Washington holds a victory over the Aggies at Corvallis.

The Huskies have one more tough game away from home—against Idaho at Pullman—and then have two return contests with Oregon and O. A. C. in Seattle. In the last four years Oregon has beaten Washington every time they played at Seattle and the Aggies are considered fully as strong as the Huskies, so the Seattle quintet will have to keep going at top speed to retain its supremacy.

The Aggies, to remain in the running, must defeat Oregon at Corvallis next Saturday. That will be no easy task, as Bob Hager's proteges had their hands full posing out the Websters at Eugene Saturday, 25 to 24.

In the south the race still is uncertain, with Southern California and Southern Branch having a decided edge over California and Stanford. The Trojans were to have played the Cards at Palo Alto Saturday, but the game was postponed because of influenza epidemics. The Trojans and Cards will play two games at Los Angeles Friday and Saturday.

California and Southern Branch will conclude their three-game series at Oakland Saturday. The Bears and Bruins split in a two-game series, California winning Friday, 25 to 24, and Southern Branch retaliating the following night, 28 to 25.

The only important northern game was between O. A. C. and Oregon. In the other contests, Washington spanked Montana, 44 to 24, and Idaho added a victory at the expense of the much-defeated Gonzags, 33 to 24.

Montana takes the road today, playing the Aggies at Corvallis tonight and Oregon at Eugene Tuesday night. Washington winds up its road trip this week-end, meeting Washington State at Pullman Friday and Idaho at Moscow Saturday.

The game was a thriller from start to finish with Baker holding the lead most of the time until the last few minutes of play. At the end of the first quarter the score stood 6 to 2 in favor of Baker, and at the half 8 to 6 in the Bulldogs' favor. The two teams were tied with nine points each at the end of the third period.

The Mac high boys seemed to gain speed the longer they played, while the Bulldogs slackened their pace as the game progressed. Baker made the first basket at the end of three minutes play. The speed of the game is believed to have caused the Baker boys to play a rugged game.

Veteran Is Again U. S. Ski Champion

Mandell Ready For His Yearly Crown Defense

CHICAGO (AP)—The shiek of the lightweight boxers, Sammy Mandell, who likewise is king of that division, has promised to defend his championship here next summer, which will be about the time of his second anniversary as world's lightweight title holder.

It will be only the second time that Mandell has entered the ring to defend his crown, but he has been one of the busiest boxers who ever held the championship—in non-title bouts.

Since the era of big purses sifted down even to the lighter classes of boxers, champions can hardly afford to risk their titles in indoor bouts where the gate receipts seldom run more than \$20,000, to \$30,000, and outdoor championship matches just haven't been offered by any promoter. At least this is the contention of Mandell and Eddie Kane, his manager.

Last summer Mandell won from Phil McGraw at Detroit with an unmistakable superiority and that is the only time he has hung up his crown for the contenders to shoot at. Lots of boys who could make the 125-pound weight and several who would not without sawing off a leg, have had a chance to whale away at the champion's chin, when the title was not involved.

Gradually, Mandell has been trying to live down his early reputation as a powder-puff fighter, one who hits and runs away to hit again some other round. Against Jackie Fields on the coast a year ago he fought a terrific match. He stood toe to toe and slugged with Spug Myers in Chicago. He tried, the same thing with Billy Petrolini in Minneapolis and took one on the chin that had him doing some rapid back-peddaling for a few minutes.

Mandell and Kane, being thrifty business men, take the view that they should receive, for a shot at the title, at least as much as they themselves put up for their chance when Sammy won the crown from Rocky Kansas of Buffalo in Chicago, July 2, 1926. To meet Kansas' guarantee of \$50,000, Mandell and Kane put up their own money, and Kansas took it down for the gate fell short of the guarantee by nearly \$20,000.

Football Rule Changes Agreed On By Committee

NEW YORK, Feb. 6 (AP)—Three important changes in the football code governing the lateral pass, muffed punt and so called "screening" of the forward pass were announced today by the national football rules committee through William S. Lanford, secretary.

The most important change was made in the lateral pass rule, which was amended to allow recovery of a fumbled lateral by the defense. "The ball being dead, however, at the point of recovery. The rule likewise added light to the definition of a lateral pass.

The new rule said: "On any such pass (other than a pass from the snapper back) which is clearly thrown a distance of approximately two yards through the air and is not merely handed to or toward another player, the ball, if it hits the ground, is a free ball but is dead at the point of recovery, counting a down if recovered by the passing side."

The change in the "muffed" punt rule was simple and designed to differentiate between a "muffed" and a fumble, a most point during the season of last fall by removing the distinction. The rule said: "A player who is off side is put

on side when the ball is touched by an opponent, but when a kicked ball other than a free kick or one that is blocked and does not cross the line of scrimmage, is legally recovered by the kicker's side, the ball shall be declared dead at the point of recovery."
