BUTTER PRICES SHOW INCREASE

Eggs Remain Steady—Meats Unchanged, Onion Move Moderate

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 16 (AP)—Butter prices fluctuated a trifle at the dairy exchange session here yesterday, resulting in a half-cent increase in the quotations on standards and firsts today, and a similar decline for extras. Standards and extras were both quoted at 44½¢ today, while prime firsts and firsts are both selling at 43¢. Demand from Seattle was large yesterday and considerable local offerings are moving north.

Eggs remained steady at yesterday's meeting with receipts fairly heavy and demand good. No price changes were noticeable on the country around and poultry markets early today but trading was brisk and demand for choice light veals excellent. Quotations on veals are around 19¢ 25¢ with a strong undertone prevailing. Light hams are likewise in good demand and are moving at 22¢ 25¢ but heavy ones are a bit druggier. Other classes of dressed meats are steady, but demand is moderate.

Oregon yellow Danvers onions were moving moderately and the market has slacked down considerably. Bids to growers recently have been mostly around \$1.15 an lb. with an occasional sale a trifle higher. Supplies in eastern markets are moderate, which portends firm prices and steady movement. Potatoes are steady and movement is light.

Wheat Strong And Higher At Close

CHICAGO, Feb. 16 (AP)—Opening ½ to 2½¢ up, wheat held near the initial figures. Corn started ½¢ to 1½¢ higher and displayed persistent strength. Oats were firmer. Provisions inclined downward.

Wheat closed strong, 2 to 2½¢ ½¢ net higher; corn unchanged to ½¢ up; oats at a shade to ½¢ gain and provisions varying from 3¢ decline to a rise of 2¢.

Broccoli Grade Warning Sent To Oregon Growers

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 16 (AP)—Warning to the Umpqua valley growers' association to grade broccoli shipments more carefully has been sent by Portland produce men, says The Portland Telegram today.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Feb. 16 (AP)—Shipments of broccoli so far from the Umpqua valley have consisted entirely of crates containing heads of miscellaneous sizes, no attempt being made because of the light volume to meet government grading standards, local shippers state. One exception, sent out last night, is made up of about 80 per cent No. 1 grade, while the rest of the car consists of ungraded heads.

Market Upturn Brief; Bears in Control Again

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 (AP)—The stock market, following a brief uptick after the opening today, began to head downward, and various oil, motor, rubber and miscellaneous shares retreated into the low ground for the year. The early strength was based on buying of public utilities on the news of state's rejection of the Walsh proposal of a senatorial investigation of super-power projects.

The closing was heavy. Buying of standard railroads, particularly Reading, initiated a forward movement in the final hour which cut down considerably earlier losses in some of the industrials. A few shares responded to aggressive pool operations again, Vanadium selling above \$5, U. S. Steel and General Motors got back to a parity with yesterday's closing figures. Total sales approximated 2,000,000 shares.
