Hudkins, Baker Tangle in New York Tonight

NEW YORK, Feb. 17 (AP)—Ace Hudkins and Sammy Baker tangle in a ten-round bout at Madison Square Garden tonight to determine the challenger for the welterweight crown now guarded by Joe Dundee of Baltimore.

Although the ace of Nebraska has been quoted as an 8 to 5 and a 2 to 1 favorite throughout the week, quite a flurry has been occasioned with reports that he is having difficulty in making the weight limit of 147 pounds.

Baker, the soldier boxer, of Mitchell Field, concluded light training yesterday below the regulation allowance tipping the beam at 146. On the other hand, Hudkins was said to weigh 145 1/2. Should he exceed 147 pounds, however, it will mean that he cannot hope to figure in the role of challenger against Dundee but must shift his activities to the middle weights in which route Mickey Walker is king.

Dick Hyland Will Wed Miss St. John

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 17 (AP)—The fiancée says today that Frank "Tricky Dick" Hyland, who scuttled at halfback position on Stanford university's football team in 1924 and 1927, has announced his engagement to Adelia Rogers St. John, authoress and scenario writer.

The engagement, says the paper, is the culmination of a romance which began last May when the grad star went to Hollywood to supervise a motion picture with a college football theme, the script for which was written by Miss St. John. Hyland later collaborated with the authoress in writing several short stories and scenarios. They will be married early in the summer, friends of the pair stated.

Three Swimming Records Smashed

MINNEAPOLIS, Feb. 17 (AP)—Three world's indoor records were shattered last night in the Central A. A. U. senior championship and open swimming meet held at the Minneapolis Athletic club. Lowell Marsh, 17, of St. Paul, a freshman at the University of Minnesota, set the mark in an exhibition swim against time, in the 440-yard backstroke.

He swam the distance in 6 minutes flat, beating the former mark of 8:02 2-1/2 minutes, held by Perry McGilivray, of the Illinois Athletic club, Chicago. At the 220-yard mark he was clocked in two minutes, 45 2-1/2 seconds as compared with the old record of 2:45 2-1/2 held by McGilivray. At 440 yards, his time was 5:21 2-1/2. The best former time was held by "Stubby" Kruger, also of the Illinois Athletic club.

Jake Schaefer Is Billiard Winner

CHICAGO, Feb. 17 (AP)—Young Jake Schaefer, world's champion at 14.2 ballroom billiards sound up an eight-game series last night as winner over Walter Oehran, former title holder, 2,727 to 2,188. In a total of 44 frames Oehran won three of the 28-point blocks and Schaefer five.

In the third block Schaefer ran 400 points, an entire block, for the third highest score ever made in a professional match.

INCOME TAX FACTS

No. 6
To be allowed an exemption of \$2,500 a married couple must have "lived together" in the eyes of the law for the entire taxable year. However, in the absence of continuous residence together the question of whether man and wife are living together depends upon the character of separation. If, occasionally, the husband is away on business, or if, for any necessary reason, a temporary separation exists, the full exemption is allowed. But when the husband habitually and continuously makes his home at one place and the wife at another, they are classed as single persons, and each is allowed an exemption of \$1,500 only.

In the absence of continuous actual residence together, whether a person with dependent relatives is the head of a family, and therefore entitled to an exemption of \$3,500, also depends upon the character of the separation. If a father is away on business or a child or other dependent is away at school or on a visit, the exemption being maintained, the exemption applies. If a parent is obliged to maintain his dependent children in a boarding house while he lives elsewhere, the exemption may still apply. But if benefactor and dependent needlessly and continuously live apart, the status of a head of a family does not exist irrespective of the support given.

Kleical, Father Of Fighter, Shot; Son Is Arrested

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Feb. 17 (AP)—Thomas Kleical, 74, father of Stanley Kleical, whose sensational career in the prize ring was cut short by an assassin, has met a similar fate.

Kleical's body, with the throat slashed, was found in a barn July at the farm home yesterday. John Kleical, a son in whose possession a blood-stained knife was found, was held.

The killing, occurring nearly 17 years after Stanley was shot to death at Conway, Mo., is believed by authorities to have had its motive in a dispute over land left by the former middleweight champion, which since has multiplied in value. John, arrested several miles from the scene of the slaying denied connection with the killing, but refused to answer questions, police said. He would give no account of his movements or explain the blood-stained knife. A cap, which was picked up near the spot where the body was found was identified by Arthur Kleical, another brother as the property of the man held.

Oregon Freshmen Defeat Salem

EUCLINE, Ore., Feb. 17 (AP)—Outscoring a nine-point lead in the last half the University of Oregon freshmen basketball team last night won from the Salem High school team 25 to 20.

From the time of the game they led the way, but the Salem team seemed certain of victory. In the first period the visitors cheerily outplayed the home team. The first quarter ended with a 7-4 score in favor of Salem. The second period the home school, trying hard to break through the Salem defense, the rally ended enough baskets to bring the score up to 24 to 21. Woodward Archer, former Medford high star, jumped in a long shot to open the third quarter and another rally was on. Salem seemed stumped, and the Fresh romped through to win.

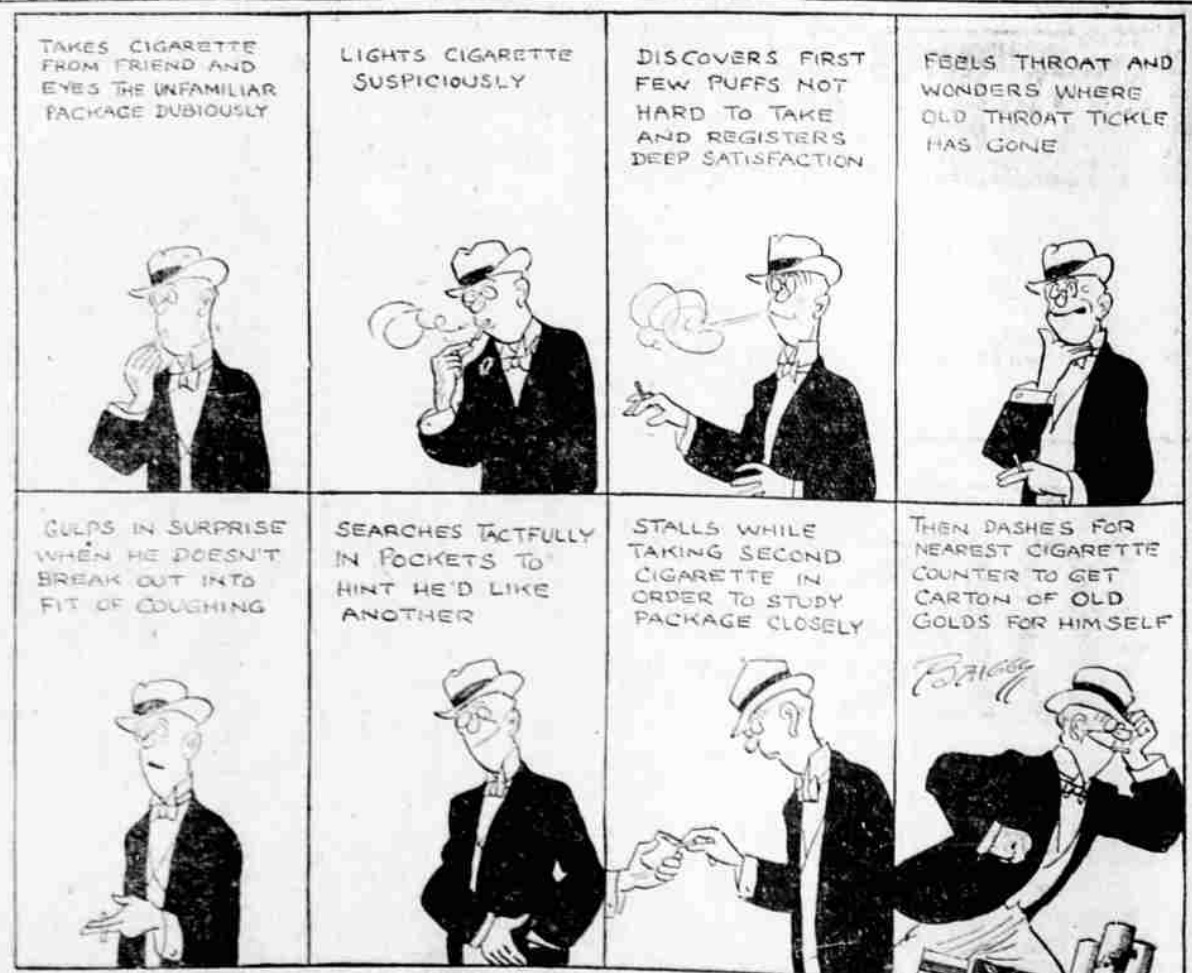
