## HEALTH

### OF CRIPPLED CHILDREN. THE BETTER THE RESULT

There are three main agencies which are responsible for the child becoming physically defective. If it were not for children who were born so, and for disease and accidents, there would be no crippled children.

Grouping those who are in this condition at birth in the order of frequency of occurrence, one considers:

Congenital Club Foot. By this is meant a child born with a distorted foot. The time to begin treatment of the club foot is at birth and where successfully carried out, this type of patient should be cured before the walking age is reached. If, through neglect or improper treatment, such a successful outcome is not achieved, then an operation should be done which offers a cure to the so-called distorted foot.

Distortion of Hip—Children born with this condition are not discovered to be crippled, as a rule, until they begin to walk, which with this class of patient is about at the age of 18 months. The child with a congenital dislocated hip has a peculiar gait which is easily recognized by the parents. When so discovered, treatment should be immediately instituted, and the most successful way is by the bloodless operation method.

These children also have a slight cross-eye and secondary deformities are imperfectly shaped heads.

Why or Distorted Neck is recognized by the child always looking toward one shoulder, without rotating the head to the other shoulder. This is due to a short muscle on one side of the neck.

The vast majority of these cases can be cured during a course of treatment from 9 to 12 months, but when the bloodless reduction has been unsuccessful, cutting measures will sometimes be effective.

Wry or Distorted Neck is recognized by the child always looking toward one shoulder, without rotating the head to the other shoulder. This is due to a short muscle on one side of the neck.

The vast majority of these cases can be cured during a course of treatment from 9 to 12 months, but when the bloodless reduction has been unsuccessful, cutting measures will sometimes be effective.

Unavoidable Accidents at Birth—These sometimes cause a very slight brain lesion which results in a paralysis of an upper and lower limb. This type of paralysis brightens up the muscles and the patient uses his arm or leg in a very halting way. Muscle training, massage, and encouragement to use the affected limbs helps these individuals considerably, and after they have reached the age of 5 or 6 years, nerve operations improve their movements 50 to 60 per cent.

The time of beginning treatment of the five aforementioned conditions materially influences whether the child shall be cured or only improved. The earlier treatment is instituted, the better the results to be expected.

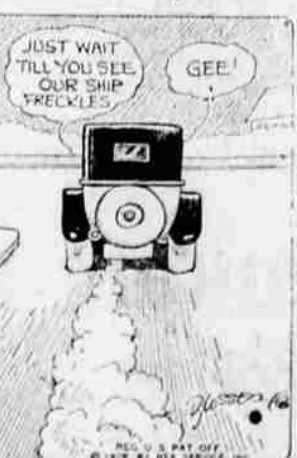
