PRODUCE MARKET IS QUIET TODAY

Holiday Curtails Trading
—Four Resignations
from Exchange

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 22 (AP).—Portland wholesale produce market was decidedly quiet today on account of many local firms being closed in observance of Washington's birthday.

Both butter and eggs were steady today except for a cent decline in the price of standard first eggs following a drop to 25c at yesterday's dairy exchange session.

Four resignations were presented at yesterday's session of the exchange as a climax to the disagreement which arose at the previous session. Those who indicated their intention to withdraw from the body are: Pacific Co-operative Poultry Producers' Association, Marion Pacific Co., A. T. McCauley, and Lates and Tison. The resignations were referred to the membership committee and will be acted upon Friday, when it is expected that they will be accepted. The rupture is a result of internal bickering in the exchange. It is said, the outgrowth of charges that certain members have practiced unfairly in the purchase and sale of eggs at prices other than those established at exchange meetings. Changes in the method of egg grading have also caused much dissatisfaction within the body. Reports indicate, and the present unpleasantness has been brewing for some time.

Country dressed meats were firm today, although trading was light in all departments. Veal is still scarce and in good demand, around 20-22c for choice lights. Beef prices are also a trifle firmer although movement is still decidedly light and supply liberal. Hogs are steady, best lights bringing 12-13c. Lambs are firm at 24-25c.

Poultry prices are steady and firm at yesterday's quotations. No change is noticeable in the onion market, bids to growers hovering mostly around \$29.25 and sacks, while prices to retailers are around \$29.25. Potatoes are also steady at the weak prices which have prevailed all season.

Reed's Harmony Plea Applauded In Tulsa, Okla.

TULSA, Okla., Feb. 22 (AP).—The plea of Senator James Reed, of Missouri, for party harmony was a round of applause as he carried on his speech campaign before a crowded hall here last night.

"We democrats can't get party together," he warned, "by writing our party differences into a platform. You can put things in a platform, but you can't make more against their judgment."

An attack on the protective tariff, which he attributed as the cause of the farmers' ills was completed here by the Missouri democratic presidential candidate with another assault on the administration and plea for the return of honesty in government.

HOOVER IN NEW YORK
NEW YORK, Feb. 22 (AP).—Herbert Hoover, in a 12-hour visit to New York, confined himself to his work as commercial leader, humanitarian and engineer. He refused to discuss politics and did not visit the Hoover-for-President headquarters here.

He left for Washington immediately after receiving the Samuel H. Kress medal in recognition of his engineering services at a banquet of the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers last night.

Convicted Group
Planning Appeal
WASHINGTON, Feb. 22 (AP).—Although Harry P. Sinclair and his co-defendant in the oil contempt case have been found guilty, much court procedure and considerable time must elapse before they can be either compelled to take their punishment or be freed.

Two courses of court action were open today for them in appeal to higher tribunals than that of Justice Suddens of the District of Columbia supreme court, who sentenced Sinclair, William J. Burns, W. Sherman Burns and Henry Mason Day yesterday.

The men will have 30 days in which to get before the court of appeals the entire record of the case in which their counsel have urged an appeal. This time is seldom extended by the court except for very important reasons.

TWO MEN HELD
KELSO, Wash., Feb. 22 (AP).—Two men held up the clerk, two guns and a taxi driver in the lobby of the Washington hotel at midnight last night, obtaining \$100 cash.

The holdup men, ordered those in the lobby to "sit back" and "let the robbery wait no longer," and was recognized by the clerk as a man who registered at the hotel two weeks ago under the name of James D. Young. The hotel register was taken to the holdup men.

WALKER FIGHTS TONIGHT
SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 22 (AP).—Mickey Walker, middleweight champion, weighed 174 1/2 pounds and Jack Willis, Texas, weighed 162 pounds for their ten-round non-title bout at the Aragon this afternoon. Willis had agreed to weigh not less than 162 pounds for the contest. Boring today continued to favor Walker by 2 to 1 odds.

BASIN BILL LAID OVER
WASHINGTON, Feb. 22 (AP).—The Columbia basin irrigation project reported favorably late yesterday by the senate irrigation committee, was laid over after Senator Jones sought passage of an amendment by Senator Hiram. The Hiram amendment, acceptable to Jones, was offered to respect Idaho from a distribution of the states water supply.

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
