HELIX TO PLAY M. I. A. TONIGHT

Winner of Contest Will Have Claim to the East Oregon Hoop Title

A hoop contest which may be on par with many college basketball games is scheduled for this evening at 8:30 o'clock at the L. D. S. Recreational hall, when the Helix "Red Devils" and the La Grande First Ward M. I. A. teams will clash to determine the Eastern Oregon independent championship. Helix has held the title for three years, part of that time playing under the name of Purple Giants. The last time the La Grande fans witnessed the Helix aggregation in action was a few years ago when a local five, including MacTavish, McDonald, Garity and others, trimmed the Helix team here but lost at Helix. Since then Helix has held the championship.

The team has been revamped somewhat since then, two or three newer players crowding into the lineup. Four college graduates are on the team and a fifth man has played freshman basketball at college.

Helix Strong

An idea of the strength of the Red Devils is gained from the fact that Whitman university won by one point from Helix. Later Whitman defeated Willamette university in two games and Williams won from the M. I. A. here. On this comparison of scores, the First Ward five will go into the game with the "dope" against it.

However, since the Willamette game, the First Ward cagers have improved considerably, which was demonstrated in the contest with the Portland L. D. S. team (champion of the Portland church league) which the M. I. A. won 62 to 21. The same combination used against Portland will take the floor against Helix tonight and a close, exciting game is anticipated.

Wallowa Game Postponed
The First Ward was to have played Wallowa high school here tomorrow night but this game was postponed, as Wallowa and Joseph play Saturday night and Wallowa desired to have its players fresh for the contest. The game may be played later or it may be cancelled entirely, this to be determined later.

Indications are that a large crowd will witness the contest this evening. The M. I. A. is gaining a larger following of fans and, with a team of the known strength of Helix as the opposition, a big attendance is looked forward to.

Mickey Walker Wins Bout With Cowboy Slugger

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 23 (AP)—The fighting reputation of Jack Willis, Texas cowboy slugger who was enhanced today as the result of his surprising showing in a ten-round bout with middle-weight champion Mickey Walker here yesterday.

Walker won the decision, but for seven rounds the "toy bulldog" had a hard fight on his hands as he has experienced since he won his title.

An elusive fighter and a tremendous short ender Willis rushed the champion from rope to rope in the third and sixth rounds and in the seventh round he had Walker so bewildered that the champion did not hear the bell. Ringside critics gave the Texan a slight margin at the end of the seventh round.

A terrific attack was launched by the champion in the eighth round and Willis was groggy at the bell from heavy rights and lefts to the face and mid-section. In the ninth Willis suffered severe body punishment and his momentary rally in the last round was nipped quickly by Walker.

The title was not at stake as Willis weighed 163 pounds and Walker 141 1/2. Some 12,000 persons saw the bout, and gross gate receipts were estimated at \$30,000.

Vandal Cagers Nose Out Aggie Quintet, 22 to 20

MOSCOW, Ida., Feb. 23 (AP)—University of Idaho closed its home conference basketball season here last night by nosing out the Oregon Aggies in the last minute of play winning 22 to 20. Idaho took an early lead in the first period, but near the end a revamped Aggie five closed the gap and forged a point ahead of the Vandals, hanging on almost to the final gun.

ASHTON, Ida., Feb. 23 (AP)—While sun and blizzard battled for supremacy, Tud Kent, veteran musher, raced his crack team of dogs about the course here to win the eleventh annual Ashton dog derby.

Seventeen drivers yesterday splashed through the slush behind their teams while a crowd estimated at more than 5000 lined Main street and cheered at what "old timers" declared was the most hotly contested race on record here.

Kent's victory—his sixth since the race was inaugurated—won for him first prize of \$1000 and a silver loving cup donated by a Salt Lake City jewelry store. His time of two hours, 13 minutes, 37 seconds for the 25-mile course is more than 15 minutes slower than the record set two years ago.

Other finishing in the money were Ray Peterson, St. Anthony, Idaho; Roy Stover, McCall, Idaho; and Ted Goelan, McCall, Veneta, 17-year-old Ashton girl, did not place in the money but her spirited driving won applause rivaling that offered the winner.
