same.FARMERS NEAR
WALLOWA WILL
FIGHT RODENTSWALLOWA, Ore., Feb. 24 (Spec-
ial)—With the early appearance
of ground squirrels in this county,
the interest of farmers is being
centered on the matter of killing
the pests as rapidly as possible
before other feed becomes plenti-
ful, when it is much more difficult
to get the rodents with poisoned
grain. The spring of the year
when the soil is full of moisture
also affords the most effective
time for using poison gas to a
good advantage. This method of
combating the rodents has been
adopted by a number of farmers
over the county during the past
two or three years.The creation of a rodent control
district, comprising a large farm-
ing and range area in the hill sec-
tion east of here, last year, is be-
lieved by many to have marked
the most effective movement ever
started here, in getting a large
number of land owners to put out
poison at the most effective times
of the year. There was talk of
forming other districts during the
early part of the year, but nothing
has been learned as to whether any
further districts have been created
or not.
