UNION TOURNEY OPENS THURSDAY

Either Ontario or Nyssa to Participate—Drawing to Be Monday

With the Union district basketball tournament scheduled to begin next Thursday afternoon at 7 o'clock, final steps are being taken this weekend to select the two teams to enter from the Harney-Malheur sub-district and from Grant county.

A tournament is now in progress at Ontario and this evening Nyssa and Ontario high school teams will play in the finals, the winner to enter the Union tourney. Nyssa eliminated Burns yesterday 20 to 19 and Ontario trimmed Vale 25 to 17. In the evening Nyssa eliminated Vale, if Nyssa should win from Ontario tonight, a second game will be necessary as the double elimination plan is being used and Ontario is undefeated.

Drawing Here Monday
The drawings for places in the first round of the Union tournament will be made in La Grande Monday evening at 8 o'clock in the high school building. In the event that the two remaining entries are not yet determined, places will be drawn for them.

With the selection earlier this week of Amory "Slats" Gill to assist Ralph Coleman as referee, the official roster is completed. Supt. Roy Conklin of Union will again manage the tournament. Minor officials are being appointed by him.

Reports from Union state that alterations made recently in the Union High school gymnasium will enable the tournament officials to accommodate more than 1200 fans at a time, with more comfort than was previously possible.

With six of the eight representatives already chosen in their respective sub-districts, a series of hotly contested games appear to be in prospect, tournament officials believe. La Grande, Wallowa and Joseph will attend as representatives of sub-district one. Union will play by virtue of being in a sub-district by itself. Baker and Haines will come to Union as the result of the play-off of the Baker county tournament last week, assisted by the action of the state basketball board which automatically eliminated the speedy North Powder team for playing an ineligible man. Sub-districts four and five comprising Grant county in one group and Harney and Malheur counties in the other have not settled their representatives.

Expect Close Games
Predictions regarding the possible outcome of the tournament indicate close scores and fast games. Both Wallowa and Joseph have powerful veteran teams, as does Baker. No "dark horse" is available on the comparative merits of the "branch line" teams and Baker, but it is known that La Grande, starting in the season with a scarcity of veterans has developed steadily throughout the winter and will undoubtedly figure strongly in the tournament play.

Play Starts Thursday
Union fans do not have championship aspirations, due to a lack of reserve strength which will limit the staying ability of the team. However Coach Colburn has a few "dark horse" prospects that have not performed much previously this season, who are expected to stiffen the offense of the "Bob Cats" somewhat. The other two teams from the more remote counties are totally unknown quantities but are expected to be worthy opponents as interest in basketball has greatly increased in that direction resulting in fast competition.

The schedule for the tournament calls for play to start at 2:00 and 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon and evening on Thursday; at 9:30 in the morning and at 2:00 and 7:30 in the afternoon and evening on Friday, concluding with two sessions on Saturday at 2:00 and 8:00 p. m.

M'LARNIN WHIPS TERRIS IN FIRST

Knocks Out East Side Lightweight Contender—Crowd Cheers

NEW YORK, Feb. 25 (AP)—Jimmy McLarnin, of Los Angeles, stood out today as the foregone challenger for the world's lightweight championship now defended by Sammy Mandell. Last night Jimmy by a sensational knockout in the first round, beat Sid Terris of New York's East Side. McLarnin displayed more than his baby face before some 15,000 spectators in Madison Square Garden. He exhibited two sweeping drives with a sturdy right arm, one of which fell with terrific force on his foe's chin, sending him to the resined canvas to be counted out after one minute and 47 seconds of fighting.

Startling Finish
The startling finish was followed by a great demonstration for the Los Angeles fighter who was carried through the cheering throng to his dressing room on the shoulders of his admirers.

Terris, idol of the East Side for years, went in his corner after recovering consciousness from the blow that shattered his present aspirations for lightweight honors. The fierce fight fans booed Terris as he slipped from the arena and made his way past the patrons. This was McLarnin's first appearance in a New York ring and he made a big hit with the fans, many of whom doubted reports of his dangerous punching attack which had preceded him here.

Much Prestige
McLarnin's triumph over Terris brought the California puncher prestige in the lightweight ranks and clearly established him as the leading rival for Mandell. Previously, McLarnin had knocked out 140 lbs (Kid) Kaplan, Jackie Fields and Joey Seiger.

He was on the short end of the betting throughout the week with Terris ruling the favorite at 5 to 5. However, when the boxes entered the ring last night the odds had receded to 6 to 5.

McLarnin scaled 132 1/2 pounds the same as Terris. There had been reports that McLarnin would have trouble in keeping within the division limit of 134 pounds but after his success in reporting two and a half pounds under the scale he proved his right to continue in the light weight fold.

State Tourney May Use Double Elimination Plan

WILLAMETTE UNIVERSITY, Salem, Ore., Feb. 25—Al French, Portland and Ralph Coleman, Oregon State colleges, have been chosen to referee games in the Oregon state high school basketball tournament here March 15, 16 and 17. It was announced today. These men officiated last year.

Plans are being worked out for a double elimination tournament this year, and discontinuing the consolation tournament. Officials at Medford, Eugene, Marshfield and Wasco high schools wrote Coach French after the tournament last year suggesting the desirability of this change. Under the proposed system each team would have to be defeated twice before elimination from the title competition.

It is also planned to award the trophies at a banquet after the tournament where all players, coaches and newspapermen will be guests, instead of on the floor after the final game as in the past. The all-state team will be announced at the banquet also.

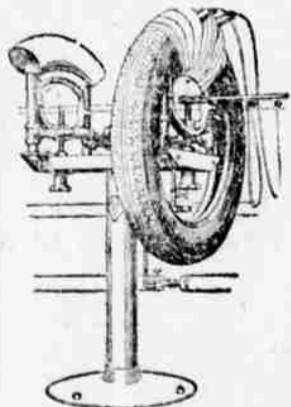
