## INCOME TAX FACTS

No. 16

Amounts paid or accrued within the taxable year 1927 an interest on indebtedness are deductible, with certain exceptions, from gross income in determining net income. Such items include interest on money borrowed for the purchase of real estate. If a person owes money secured by a lien or mortgage on his home, the amount of interest paid on such indebtedness may be deducted. However, interest need not be evidenced by lien, judgment or mortgage to make the interest thereon deductible. Presently, indebtedness is evidenced only by notes without additional security.

Interest paid on behalf of a friend or relative where there is no legal obligation on the part of the payer can not be deducted. In such case the payment amounts to a loan or gift.
