England Wants Pacific Mohair, Wool Men Learn

For the first time in history, Great Britain, which has hitherto been a mohair exporting country, is seeking mohair from the United States.

The Pacific Co-Operative Wool Growers has just received requests from one of the largest mohair mills in Bradford, Eng., to supply them with type samples of domestic American mohair, together with particulars as regards deliveries and prices.

Last year a shipment of Texas kid hair was made direct to England which brought better prices than were obtainable in this country at the time. This was the first shipment of mohair in this country

going to England, according to H. A. Ward, general manager of the Pacific Co-Operative Wool Growers. Mr. Ward states our Bradford correspondents expressed the opinion that in the future America would become a potential exporter of mohair to Great Britain, and accordingly mills wish at this time to establish relations with desirable sources of supply in the United States.

America has become quite a mohair producer during the last five years. Production in this country at the present time is approximately 13,000,000 pounds annually, while five years ago it was only approximately 5,000,000 pounds.

MISLEADS HUSBAND TO SAVE HER HOME

Mrs. Myron Boyer Admits Deceiving Him Respecting Birth of a Son

DETROIT, Mich., Mar. 2 (AP)—Declaring "a woman is entitled to do anything necessary to save her home," Mrs. Myron L. Boyer admitted today that she had deceived her husband respecting the birth of a son and heir.

The husband, a son of Joseph Boyer, chairman of the board of directors of the Barronage Boarding Machine company, has filed a petition in circuit court calling upon state officials to expunge from the state archives a record which now states the boy is his son. The petition charges that Mrs. Boyer admitted to her husband that she had deceived him, that she adopted the child, now four years old, in its infancy and misled Boyer into believing it was his own.

"Everything Mr. Boyer charges in his suit is true; I did adopt a baby a few hours old and told Mr. Boyer it was our child," Mrs. Boyer said. "It was a desperate measure to save our home. I thought an heir, a child's love, would make Mr. Boyer happy and contented. It did—for 13 months. Then not even the baby could hold him."

"I have lost a home but won a child and the deceit has been worth a thousand times what it cost," she added. "I love this boy more than anything else in the world."

Until the deception became known—six months ago when a nurse informed her husband, Mrs. Boyer said—the child, named Joseph Boyer for his "grandfather" was sole heir to an estate of \$5,000,000 held in trust for him on his 20th birthday.

Three Persons Knew

Only three persons knew of the deception, Mrs. Boyer said. "They were the doctor and the nurse who attended me at the supposed birth of the child, and myself. The doctor has died. The nurse—it was she who told my husband of the deception. It was a question of money."

Mrs. Boyer said she had no intention of defrauding the Boyer family of a large inheritance. "When I took the child," she said, "I did not know that my husband's heir was to inherit the whole \$5,000,000 trust fund."

"I thought the boy would receive just the income from the estate. When I discovered that this was not so, I wrote a history of the case and attached it to my will. I thought that was only fair to the family which has been so splendid to me."

Mrs. Boyer said she realizes her son may lose everything in the world "but my love." "I love only my boy," she said, and added that "I can always support him no matter what happens."

Mrs. Boyer is 36 years old. Before her marriage she was Miss Laura Miller of Kansas City, Mo.

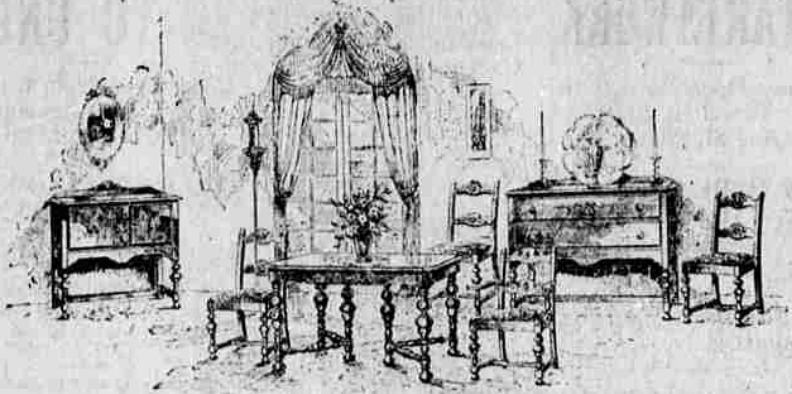

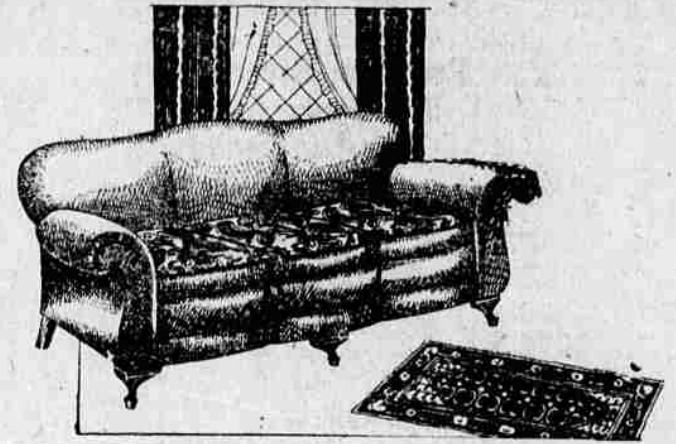

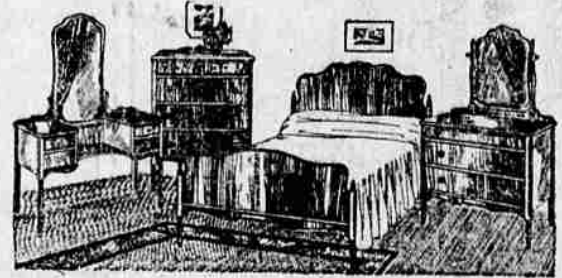
