MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Mar. 8 (AP)—Rumors that the heavyweight boxing champion of the world had made formal surrender to romance today remained simply rumors, neither confirmed nor denied.

Reporters had quizzed Gene Tunney had filled with questions his rumored fiancee, Miss Caroline Bishop of Beverly Hills, Cal., but the best they could earn with either was a draw.

Miss Bishop admitted she found the ring king "one of the most admirable men of our age." Mr. Tunney confessed he believed the California visitor here "one of the loveliest girls" he had ever known. Yet both considered pointed questions about their alleged betrothal "unfair" and said so, although neither went so far as to enter even denial.
