SATURDAY TRADE RECORDS BROKEN

Another Wild Orgy in Stock Exchange; General Motors Up and Down

NEW YORK, Mar. 10 (AP)—All Saturday trading records were broken in another wild orgy of speculation on the New York stock exchange today when total sales for the two-hour session ran above 2,000,000 shares for the first time.

General Motors touched a record top for the seventh consecutive session at \$161 a share and then sold down to \$157.75, which was \$2 a share below yesterday's final quotation. Heavy profit-taking sales checked the advance in most of the active issues, which closed lower.
