90 RACERS NEAR FLAGSTAFF, ARIZ.

Arthur Newton Again Shows Heels to Others in Pyle's Marathon

WILLIAMS, Ariz., Mar. 17. (AP)—The fourteenth lap of the Los Angeles to New York transcontinental footrace found the field facing a 35-mile trek to Flagstaff, highest city in Arizona, approximately 6700 feet above sea level.

More than 90 runners lined up for the starting signal at 2 o'clock. Standings of the leaders in elapsed time for the 478.8 miles now put behind since the racers left Los Angeles March 4, remained unchanged following yesterday's grind from Selman to Williams.

Arthur Newton of Rhodesia, South Africa, topped the list with 74:21:05. He showed his heels to the rest, checking in with time of 7:10:35. It was the seventh first place for the 44-year-old hundred-mile running champion of England, who ended yesterday's test with a little more than eight hours lead on his nearest rival, Nicholas Quamawahu, Hopi Indian, one of the luminaries of the race and outstanding favorite at the start, was absent today when the runners took position. He gave up yesterday after covering 25 miles on account of a sprained ankle and leg injury.

ONE KAYO IN EUGENE. EUGENE, Ore., Mar. 17. (AP)—One knockout and two draws marked Friday night's boxing card at the armory. Two decisions were made in the preliminary battles. Billy Welburne of Eugene and Pete Wille of Salem in a main double event, slashed and cut at each other for a draw at the end of six rounds. In the other main event, Bob McIntyre of Salem won a decision over Harry Tracey of Eugene. Jimmy Lee, University of Oregon 148-pound boxer, reaped the oats in one minute and 30 seconds after he entered the ring against Harry Wade of Tillamook.
