It isn't quite clear whether men let themselves grow stout because they have more sense than women, or less courage.

Some observers are inclined to doubt the political good sense Mr. Hoover displays in entering the Ohio and Indiana primaries against favorite sons. No one, however, can doubt his courage. Both battles will have an important effect on the convention course at Kansas City but perhaps Hoover's entry into these states is worth the risk. If nominated he will have to fight the democratic nominee in the same territory. Why not fight the rivals within his own party in the same states now? If he wins one or both these important states he will go to the convention with a distinct advantage. The opposite will probably be true if he loses. Fortunately, Hoover is big enough to take that risk. He's willing to stand on his record, his ability now as well as in November. Better to beat Lowden and Dawes (to whom Watson would turn) in Indiana now than to have to beat them at Kansas City.

NO BETTER, NO WORSE

The visit of the normal school building committee to La Grande yesterday, although unimportant as far as the actual construction program is concerned, served to clear the air locally and to re-assure interested citizens. Starting the building is possible only by a majority vote of the board of regents. And that, in turn, is possible only when additional state revenue is available so that the expenditure will not increase the deficit in that general fund, or when a majority of the regents are convinced that the amount required for the building, \$175,000, is not sufficient to bankrupt the state in any event, and the saving to be occasioned by a delay would not be forth the handicap to present educational needs of Eastern Oregon.

Quite naturally the majority of people in the La Grande community are already convinced of that. They see no reason why the building cannot be constructed this year. On the other hand, they are reasonable enough to respect the present position of the governor with reference to state finances, and sensible enough to abide by the decision and established policy of the board of regents until conditions or fair, unprejudiced arguments can result in a change in that policy.

The Observer has been closely in touch with normal school developments and with present obstacles for the last year, and it is our opinion that the prospects for building this year are bright. If that is not accomplished there is practically no question about its being realized soon thereafter. The important thing, from a community standpoint, is patience and a spirit of co-operation with the board of regents.
