Stellar Cast Supports Emil In Latest

Emil Jannings' latest American-made picture, "The Last Command" comes to the Arcade theater Thursday for a three day run, with the great European actor surrounded by the most imposing supporting cast assembled for any of this season's pictures.

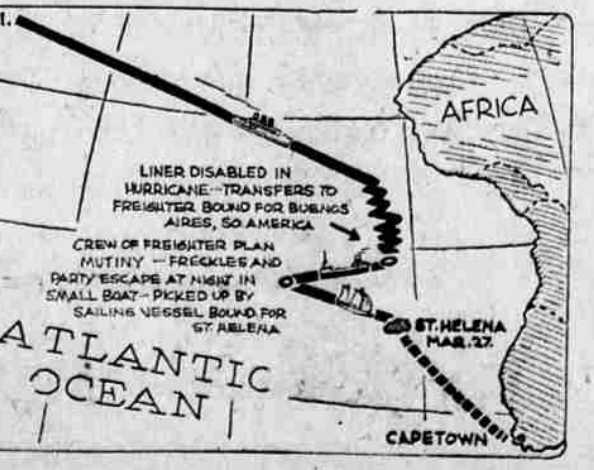
