

L. A. WATER USERS TO PAY DAMAGES

Six More Bodies Are Recovered from St. Francis Dam Wreckage

LOS ANGELES, Mar. 29 (AP)—The bill in dollars and cents for the

death and destruction resulting from the failure of the St. Francis dam, may be come unwritten but costly items on the accounts of Los Angeles water users. This was decided partially yesterday when officials of the municipal water bureau announced that the organization would shoulder the full responsibility of meeting the entire bill of damages—amounting to millions of dollars. The officials following a meeting with Mayor George Street, city councilmen and leading Los Angeles bankers, said that responsibility would be met by short term loans advanced by banks with the revenues of the bureau pledged as security, a bond issue, if the supreme court holds such an action legal, and an increase in water rates.

The proposed financial plan will be submitted to the Los Angeles clearing house association Monday for its approval. **Jury Adjourns**—The inquiry by a coroner's jury into the collapse of the dam with its resulting death toll of probably 434 was adjourned yesterday until

Reports Say Col. Lindbergh Will Make World Trip

WASHINGTON, Mar. 29 (AP)—The latest reports among close friends of Col. Lindbergh here have it that the flyer will make a round the world trip in a Ford plane but will span the Atlantic and Pacific by boat.

Some of his associates say they have well grounded information that the trip will be made this spring and that Lindbergh will be accompanied by Major Thomas G. Lanphier, flight commander at Selfridge field, Michigan. Since Lindbergh left here, there have been countless rumors regarding his plans, some of them fantastic. The opinion among his friends, however, is that the flyer will go to Europe by boat, taking the plane with him and, after an aerial tour of Europe and the Orient, return to the United States by boat over the Pacific. Even this report has not received Lindbergh's sanction. Major Lanphier is at present on a sixty day leave from the war department. There have been rumors that he intends to resign from the service, but the war department had no direct information on this score.

WILL NOT ANNOUNCE PLANS—ST. LOUIS, Mar. 29 (AP)—Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh declined today to announce his flying plans. He said he had heard rumors that he contemplated a trans-Pacific flight to Japan but he had "nothing to say." Colonel Lindbergh said he had some business to look after in St. Louis and did not know how long he would be here. It is understood he will leave in a few days for San Diego, Cal. to get the new monoplane which has been built for him there.

Operating Revenue Totals \$59,748,120

SAN FRANCISCO, Mar. 29 (AP)—The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company had an operating revenue of \$59,748,120 in 1927, the state railroad commission was informed in a report today. In 1926 the company's operating revenue was \$54,924,528.

Operating expenses last year, excluding taxes, were \$42,579,597, leaving a net operating revenue of \$17,168,523. During 1927 taxes charged to operation amounted to \$5,155,428. Deducting the taxes an operating income of \$12,013,173 remained.

Adding to the operating income the non-operating income of the company and deducting the non-collectible revenue and rent, results in a gross corporate income of \$14,524,297. This represents the amount available for interest, amortization of debt, discount on fixed charges, non-operating expenses, dividends and surplus.

The telephone company has an application before the railroad commission for an increase of rates in the San Francisco and other bay cities estimated at \$1,800,000 annually.

Dairy Safe Robbed Of Thousand Cash

SEATTLE, Mar. 29 (AP)—A thousand dollars in cash was obtained by safe crackers who blew off the heavy door of a safe in the west Seattle dairy during the night, officials reported to the police today.

The safe was in full view of a window and no effort had been made to screen operations. Neither was the sound of the explosion heard in nearby residences of Dairy employees found the shattered fragments of the strong box and papers and checks littered over the floor when they came to work today. No fingerprints or other clues were found.

To Attend Church Wearing Overalls

HENDERSON, Iowa, Mar. 29 (AP)—The Rev. G. D. Noland, pastor of the Christian church here, and several men in his congregation will attend church next Sunday and Sundays to follow attired in overalls. "This is not to be a show," the pastor explained, "merely was the working people to know that my church and I are one of them. I know good men who feel that our present day churches are on dress parade. If my clothes keep men away from church, I shall wear plain clothes."

Six more bodies were recovered yesterday, bringing the known death total to 217. Five were uncovered in piles of all-covered debris near and below Santa Paula, while the sixth was washed ashore near Oxnard, several miles from the mouth of the Santa Clara river. No identifications were possible.
