In our series of Bridge articles for the novice, we continue today the consideration of No Trump bids.

There is one element of strength in a hand which is not included in the Ace 4, King 3, Queen 2, Jack 1 count given last week...

On the basis of Ace-4, King-3, Queen-2, Jack-1 the count of the hand would be 12. The hand has three aces surely stopped, no sound suit-bid, and no short unprotected suit...

When a hand contains two Aces and one King, without a Jack or even a Ten to support it, I do not think that it should be bid by anyone; it counts 11 but lacks possible tricks.
