John Gilbert And Greta Garbo In "Love"

John Gilbert and Greta Garbo—the couple who made new film history in "Flesh and the Devil," appear together again—this time in a world classic and one of the most poignant human interest romances of all literature, in "Love," Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's huge film-ization of Tolstoy's "Anna Karenina," now playing at the Arcade theater for three days, starting today.

It is a more romantic Gilbert than even appeared in "The Merry Widow" who gives the remarkable portrayal of Count Vronsky, the Russian lover, in the vivid new photodrama, and Miss Garbo, as the tragic Anna, has a role that one might well imagine written specially for her.

This story is a tense human interest tale—the story of a great love that sacrifices all, and that is doomed by sinister fate and dramatic tragedy. This story is set in gorgeous surroundings; the pomp and circumstance of the Russian aristocracy before the revolution, when Russia's court was the gayest in the world.

Edmund Goulding, dramatist and screen director, scored a distinct triumph in his direction of the Russian epic, and the cast is well-nigh perfect. George Fawcett is a compelling figure as the stern old Grand Duke, and Brandon Hurst is a sometimes character but always interesting character as Count Karenin, while Emily Fitzroy's characterization of Countess Betsey leaves nothing to be desired. Little Philippe Leary plays the heroine's son in a well-balanced performance.

Court functions, military maneuvers, the snow scenes, and other brilliant detail embellish the huge production, one of the most lavish screen plays the present season has seen.

NEW GOLD COAST HARBOR DAKAR, Senegal (AP)—New deep water harbor at Dakar, Gold Coast, West Africa, will be opened April 2, permitting exports to be loaded direct into steamships instead of being carried out in surf boats and lighters. Highways, railroads and electric cranes will facilitate shipment of exports heretofore often endangered and delayed by heavy surf.

"The Whip Woman" Lashes Gloom At The Star

Exhibiting all her customary beauty and fire, Estelle Taylor appears in one of the finest dramatic pictures seen here in a long time. "The Whip Woman" is strong, though simple, in theme, and conveys a pleasant girl living on the banks of the Danube, who insists on leading her own life and who is considered something of a disgrace to her village because she will neither marry nor have a lover.

Miss Taylor is a little spitfire in this role, defending herself from the unwelcome advances of men with the butt of the whip with which she goes her ox team. Yet in her heart she cherishes every woman's dream that romantic love will come into her life.

Antonio Moreno appears and romance develops after Estelle saves him from ending his life in the Danube because he has been cast out by his family, members of the nobility. She brings him to his senses through a rap over the head with her whip and rehabilitates his self-respect.

The course of true love certainly doesn't run smooth in this story, despite its idyllic moments. And just how it happens that Estelle eventually needs—and gets—a taste of her own medicine forms the central theme of the picture.

The production is smoothly directed by Joseph C. Boyle and exquisitely photographed by Ernest Haller, both of whom were associated with Rex Ingram in Europe for several years. Allan Dwan, one of screenland's greatest directors, produced and supervised the film for Robert Kane, who presents it for First National. There is a brilliant cast throughout, including Lowell Sherman, Hedda Hopper, Julianne Johnston and Lorena Young.
