12. If it is a money game, always stop when you are ahead. It will leave a lasting impression and folks will remember you.

13. Always explain your plays, particularly when set. It shows your card knowledge.

14. Disagree with established rules and conventions. People will know you are a person of independent mind.

HEALTH

FOOD AND FAT

It is a well known fact to the stock grower that if animals are fed all the food they will eat and are kept in small corrals where they cannot run or jump about much they almost invariably get fat. It is also a well-known fact to the farmer that certain animals take on flesh with less food and more exercise than do others. The same facts are now known to be also true of the human family.

Many persons who are too fleshy eat too much and do too little muscular work. There are those, however, who eat moderately and exercise freely who still take on too much flesh.

If a person is really desirous of course vegetables and fruits for his losing weight let him substitute coarse vegetable and fruits for his rich foods. He should then gradually reduce the quantity. He will slowly become satisfied with less food. But do not let this system of starvation be carried too far. The stomach must be allowed to function properly and if, when one is hungry, coarse vegetables, lettuce without salad dressing, or fruits are eaten in sufficient quantity to satisfy the cravings of the stomach, very few calories will be added and therefore no fat will be added.

In those persons who are fat in spite of the proper diet, medical science has found that abnormalities exist. In many cases the wrong can be corrected. There are certain glands in the body whose function is to assist in the oxidation, or burning, of the elements of the food for the purpose of supplying energy. It has been known for a long time that the person whose thyroid is underactive is likely to be fat. Such a person is apt to have fat hands, neck, body, arms and legs. The condition can be improved by proper treatment.

There is another gland which has more recently been recognized as having much to do with the burning of fat in the tissues. This gland is located in the skull at the base of the brain and is known as the pituitary. In persons with this gland underactive there is said to be excess flesh on the shoulders, upper arms, trunk, abdomen, hips and thighs are large, whereas the rest of the body may be thin. Prop-

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
