Trade Quiet In Portland; Berry Shipment Here

PORTLAND, Ore., Apr. 6 (AP)—Trading was rather quiet on local markets today. Further weakness cropped out in the butter market, and prices dropped all around. Prime firsts and firsts dropped two cents per pound to 38½ and 37½, respectively, and the higher grades dropped a cent each to 40c per pound.

Eggs were steady except for a cent drop in the quotation on standard extras to 24c per dozen. Receipts yesterday were 2464 cases with 21,774 cases reported in stores.

Spring lambs are in unusually good demand and are clearing up as fast as received on the local dressed meat markets. Prices today ranged from 26 to 35c, depending on quality, while fall lambs were also higher at 25½ to 28c.

STRAWBERRIES ARRIVE—Another shipment of fresh strawberries, this time from Louisiana, has been received in La Grande for distribution to local retail markets. A few berries have been received heretofore from California and Florida, but the Pacific Fruit and Produce company states that it will probably be three weeks before the large shipments of berries arrive here.

WOOL REPORT

BOSTON, Apr. 6 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say:

"There has been a fair volume of business done in the market here during the past week at prices which show little change from those of a week ago. Last Saturday there was a fairly good movement in wool at prices more or less affected by the fact of tax day on April 2, nearly all qualities are in demand. There has been little in the way of news from the west."

"The foreign markets are generally quiet but steady. The manufacturing outlook both here and abroad is encouraging."

"The mohair market here is quiet but sales of mohair by sealed bids and privately in Texas this week have amounted to 1,500,000 to 2,000,000 pounds. Prices have ranged from 66 to 76c on adult hair and from 81 to 87c for kid, according to stock."

"The Commercial Bulletin will publish the following wool quotations tomorrow:

Scoured basis: Oregon—Fine and F. M. staples, 1.15 to 1.20; fine and F. M. clothing, 1.10 to 1.14; valley No. 1, 1.10 to 1.15.
