THE GARDEN

TURNIP ROOTS ON CABBAGES
Half way between a turnip and a cabbage comes a vegetable that is growing in popularity, the kohlrabi. It is an above-ground turnip with the leaves growing upon the turnip portion of it. This is a cool-weather vegetable and a crop for early spring planting or to plant in late summer for the fall crop. The edible portion is the thickened stem just above ground which has the mild flavor of cabbage and turnip combined, but yet is neither.

This vegetable can be transplanted but the best success is obtained in the home garden by sowing it in the row where it is to grow directly and then pulling out the plants until they stand six inches apart. It needs the same conditions as cabbage to do its best, rich soil and moisture. It should be pulled for use when the kohlrabi is about an inch and a half to two inches in diameter. If allowed to become too large and mature, they may be woody. Gathered at the right stage they are tender and delicate. They are sliced or cubed and boiled and served with a dressing of either butter or cream. The thick outer skin must be carefully pared away before cooking. It will sometimes be hard and woody, but the interior will be tender.

The kohlrabi is superior to the turnip in flavor and will never grow strong and bitter as do turnips at times. A packet will give an ample planting for the average home garden. There are two distinct types, green and purple colored. The earliest effort and the Early White Vienna are common and popular types of the green or white varieties and the Purple Vienna of the highly colored types.

There is no difference in flavor. The purple type is considered to be of easier culture than the green types because it is more heat resistant and can be planted a little earlier than the green types with a certainty of producing a good crop. It is the best type for summer sowing for a fall crop as it can stand the hot days of early fall better than the green kinds which are best for spring.

Plant a row of kohlrabis this year. They are an early summer crop.

TIME TO SWAT FLY AGAIN
WASHINGTON (AP)—Spring is a season of relaxation and rejuvenation, but it brings its peculiar responsibilities. One of them is the house fly.

The two most important ailments transmitted by flies are typhoid fever and the diarrhoeal diseases of children. These and other diseases may be transmitted in two ways, by mechanical transference and by inoculation. Flies which infect germs into the victim by biting, however, are relatively unimportant, since the blood sucking varieties are not so numerous in the United States as the house fly type.

The stiff, hairy parts of the house fly are particularly adapted to the mechanical transference of contagion. Contaminated with filth in places where conditions are especially favorable to the development of germs, it carries them to the food and drink consumed by man.

It has been suggested that the slogan, "Swat the Fly," be amended to read, "Fight the fly by destroying its breeding places, and screening it out of the house."
