Buckaroos Now Lasso Pelicans In Klamath Area

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Apr. 12 (AP)—With the open and unfenced range days doomed, lariat artists of Klamath are turning to new quarry to demonstrate their cleverness with the rope—namely, the stately and regal White Pelican. Although protected from the hunter's gun, there is nothing on the statue books which says that the great long necked yellow beaked bird—symbolic of the Klamath country—cannot be lassoed and then released. Joseph Shirk, an ex-Harney county buckaroo, initiated the new cowboy sport in Klamath yesterday. Recognized as an expert with the lariat, Shirk walked to the edge of Klamath lake and sent his lasso whistling out over the water. The horse settled gently around the neck of an astounded pelican. Gently but firmly the pelican was drawn to shore. As his discomfiture became more acute he disgorged quantities of fish which had been stored in his beak. Sensing a second-hand feast scores of gulls and terns appeared to snatch from the water while the pelican had left behind. The surprised and disoriented pelican was released and immediately charged back into the lake where he scattered the marauding birds and recovered part of his well earned meal.

Facts About The Bremen, Its Passengers

By the Associated Press THE PLANE The Bremen is a Junkers all-metal monoplane of the type successfully used on commercial lines in Germany. It is made of duralumin, a patented aluminum alloy. Its wings of full cantilever type have a spread of 55 feet and the length of the fuselage is 35 feet. There is no outside bracing to offer resistance to the wind and the thick wing gives it a high lift. The name Bremen is painted on the silver grey sides and also the government license number D-1165. The triangular emblem of the Junkers company is painted on the rudder. It has no radio.

The Motor The plane has a single Junkers L-5 air cooled motor which can develop a maximum horsepower of 250. Its maximum speed is 120 miles an hour and the spread of 30 miles an hour considered the best for its present task. The fuel consumption is from 15 to 18 gallons of gasoline an hour.

The Pilot Baron Ehrenfried Gunther von Huenefeld spent his last penny and borrowed from 14 friends to make up the \$50,000 required to cover the cost of the flight and insurance.

He was seriously wounded in the war and invalidated out of the service. He is a close friend of the former crash prince and spent some time with him in exile. He was born at Koenigsberg in 1882. He is connected with the north German Lloyd steamship line. He will act as cook and steward for his companions and keep the log book.

Captain Hermann Koehl, pilot, was born at Elm, Germany, in 1888. He was in the German aviation service during the war and in 1917 was shot down twice while piloting a bomber over the French lines. On the second occasion he was taken prisoner, but later escaped.

Colonel James Fitzmaurice, copilot, is head of the Irish Free State air force, and was born at Dublin 30 years ago. He served in the British army during the war and was wounded in 1916. He was transferred to the royal air force in 1917 and served with the army of occupation. With Captain R. H. McIntosh he made an unsuccessful attempt to make a non-stop flight to America in the Princess Xenia last year, coming down over the Irish coast.

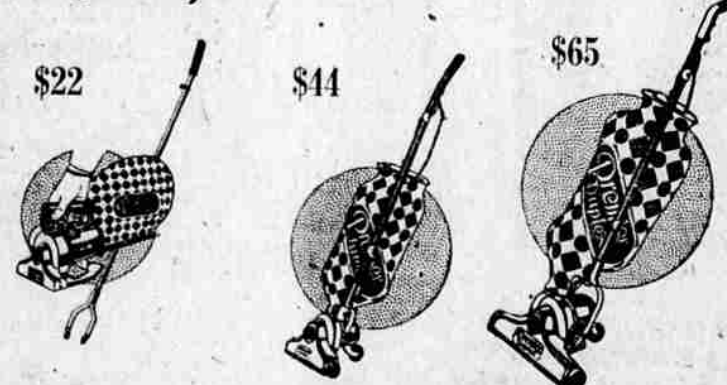
