PRINCE WEDS AMERICAN IN LONDON TODAY

LONDON, Apr. 14 (AP)—Prince Charles Philippe, duc de Nemours and Miss Marguerite Watson of Washington were married in London today.

Miss Watson was born in Richmond, Va., and has lived in Paris for a number of years. Her engagement to the late Reginald Vanderbilt was rumored in 1919, but later was broken.

The duke is the only son of the Duke and Duchess of Vendome. His mother is a cousin of King Albert of Belgium.

It had been rumored that the wedding would be postponed until May because of objection by the duke's family. The duke, however, said they would be married as soon as Miss Watson's health permitted. She was recovering from an operation for appendicitis. He also denied rumors that King Albert objected to the match.
