Holland Hopes to Take Points In Olympic Games AMSTERDAM, Holland (AP)—Holland hopes to be more than just the host to the 1928 Olympic games.

In Captain de Hoer of the track and field team, the country has a likely point winner in the broad jump while Miss M. Baron, holder of two world swimming records, has a chance for a first place in the women's swimming events.

Holland has been making rapid progress in track athletics of late under the tutelage of the Swedish American coach, Kroegsman. Besides the broad-jumping captain, the team has some promising athletes in Van den Bergh, Broos and Paulen, relay racers, and C. C. Peters, hop-skip-and-jump specialist.

As for the women swimmers, the best are the Misses Baron, Braun, den Turk and Vierdag while a number of younger women are giving them plenty of competition.

Miss Baron, the ace of the team, is best at the breast stroke in which she holds the 200-meter and 400-meter world records. Both were set in Belgium within the last two years and Miss Baron is now at the top of her form.

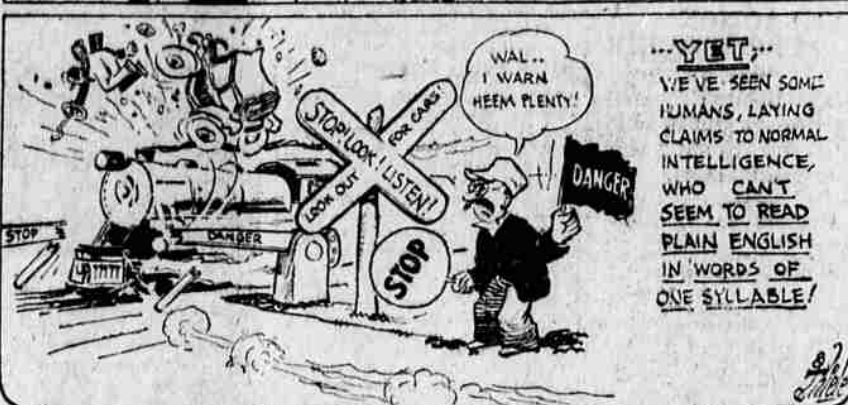
In both of these sports, track and women's swimming—the Dutch expect chief opposition from the United States.

Former Champion Is Knocked Out By the Bearcat

TOPEKA, Kans., Apr. 17 (AP)—Another of the few knockouts charged against Jack Johnson in nearly three decades was on record here today.

The former heavyweight champion, who fell before Jess Willard in 1915, was knocked out in the fifth round of a scheduled ten-round fight last night by Bearcat White, Nebraska negro.

Entering the ring weighing 235 pounds as compared to the 210 he scaled in his championship days from 1910 to 1915, Johnson now 50 years old, held Wright on nearly even terms for four rounds.

In the fifth the giant negro fell victim to a solar plexus blow followed by a right uppercut and remained down for the full count.

The fight with Wright, who weighed 211, was one of the first of the series which Johnson announced he hoped to stage before he became too old.

Gavuzzi Leading Payne In Marathon

TULSA, Okla., Apr. 17 (AP)—Peter Gavuzzi, who recently carried the colors of Southampton, England, to first place in elapsed time in the cross-country marathon, arrived from Bristow in 4:47 flat.

This gave him a lead of more than an hour over Andrew Payne of Claremore, Okla., who has dropped to second place since entering his home state.

Guisto Umek, Italian champion, was the second to arrive here. His mark of 5:28:26 gave him a total of 324:37:56. Payne, who finished third in 5:39:58 had an elapsed time of 271:47:29.

Allan Currier, Rogue river, Oregon, finished yesterday's lap in 7:42:30. His elapsed time 351:22:33.
