

World Baptists Will Gather In Toronto in June

TORONTO, Ont. (AP)—All corners of the world are expected to send preachers and laymen to the Baptist World Convention in Toronto in June.

A delegation of 100 from Australia alone is expected among the 7000 who are expected to gather here. The convention, which will open on June 23 and close June 29, is the regular gathering of representatives of the Baptist World Alliance.

Since the functions of the alliance meeting are advisory rather than legislative, churchmen explain, it is not expected that controversial matters of doctrine and interpretation that have disturbed churches in various parts of the world will be discussed.

Rev. Dr. E. Y. Mullins, president of the Southern Baptist Theological seminary, Louisville, Kentucky, who is president of the alliance, has been supervising arrangements for the convention.

Dr. Mullins reports that there has been remarkable progress by the Baptists in Roumania, especially since the granting of religious rights and freedom by the government.

"At one time they were terribly persecuted by the state church and civil authorities, but this has ceased in consequence of a petition drawn up by the alliance's executive committee and signed by Baptists all over the world," he said.

"Interesting developments are afoot among the Baptists of South America where a plan is being devised to call a Latin-American Baptist convention in 1930. Another important plan is the establishment of a Baptist theological seminary in Moscow, Russia. Part of the fund raised for this purpose will become available soon and a number of young preachers await the opening of the school's doors."

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HEALTH

WASHINGTON (AP)—Studies of the effects of sunlight and fresh air on health have convinced public health service authorities that April and May are among the best months for the periodical physical examinations which everyone is urged to have at least once a year.

If trouble is just beginning to develop, no season offers a better opportunity to make simple repairs and keep it from growing worse. If old troubles are hanging on, nature is ready to supply more bountifully than at any other time two of the most potent remedies known—sunlight and fresh air—to assist in overcoming them.

If nothing is wrong, the knowledge itself will be beneficial and the sunlight and fresh air will help toward building up a reserve of strength for defense against the germs and disease-producing conditions which must be encountered.

The value of ultra-violet rays in cases of tuberculosis and rickets is well established, but there are many other ways about which little is known. They apparently have a marked effect upon the growth, development and health of the body, and research workers feel that the progress they have made thus far has carried them merely to the threshold of a vast, uncharted field of useful information.

Fresh air brings to the body the vital element of oxygen, which is required for all life giving processes. It has also been determined that this last element with sunlight, is fundamentally important

to the normal growth and development of children and its proper use has come to be regarded as essential to the strengthening of the body for protection against diseases, particularly tuberculosis and others which attack the respiratory organs. Its general importance in this respect has been emphasized by recent studies by public health scientists, which have shown that the respiratory diseases, such as colds, pneumonia, influenza, tonsillitis, laryngitis, catarrh and sinus infections, are the most common afflictions of man and prevail practically all the year around.

Dr. Stratman-Thomas, who is 28 years old and has been doing research work under Dr. Loewenhart for the last four years, will conduct the medical crusade for the Gugenheim Memorial Foundation, which recently honored him with the distinguished award.

Like Lieut.-Col. George W. Goethals' colleagues who allowed themselves to be bitten by the mosquito to prove that it carried the malaria germ, Dr. Stratman-Thomas and Dr. Chesterman will expose themselves to the tsetse fly and perhaps sacrifice their lives to science, just as the many men who dared death as martyrs that America might build the Panama Canal.

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FIGHT FLY TO RECLAIM MILLION FERTILE MILES

A FLY, unheard of before the vogue of crossword puzzles, rules a domain of 1,000,000 fertile square miles in Africa, where no man dares to venture.

The tsetse fly! Carrying the dreaded germ of African sleeping sickness, billions upon billions of these tiny usurpers rule over a great shunned and untitled waste.

Into this great rich domain of death, Dr. Warren Stratman-Thomas, research pharmacologist at the University of Wisconsin, will venture to combat the plague that renders these acres useless to man. With him will be Dr. C. C. Chesterman, secretary of the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene. In August their expedition will start for the little village of Stanleyville, in the heart of the African jungle.

They are carrying with them drugs discovered after eight years of research by Dr. A. S. Loewenhart, head of the University of Wisconsin Pharmacology Department.

QUEEN OF FALL ANNUALS

Asters are the queens of the fall annuals, the greatest material of their season both for cutting and garden decoration. There is such a wide variety in this useful plant that it is sometimes difficult to make a selection. The two general types, the branching and the ostrich plume, are the most desirable for the main crop of asters. The late-branching types give a great crop of flowers with good stems showing an inclination to an incurved shape. The ostrich plume section, which includes the Crego, has curled and twisted petals inclined more to curling, following, in a general way, the tendency in chrysanthemums, of which they have become rivals in size and beauty.

The Giants of California and American Beauty type are noted for the size of the flowers and the length of the stems which they offer for cutting. Those with late-branching types are especially valuable. Asters need rich soil.

Thousands of persons who crowded from within and without the old North church in Hanover street last night, saw Edward Revere, little great-great-grandson of Paul Revere, hang two lanterns in the celebrated belfry symbolic of those which 133 years ago started the battle for American independence.

Two riders arranged to traverse today the identical routes pursued by Revere and Dawes in spreading the news of the approaching British.

Ten Dead, 50 Hurt In Bulgaria Quake
