BANTE PE, N. M. (AP)—Fifty thousand jackrabbits have been killed by farmers and ranchers of New Mexico in the last few months, and the slaughter is to continue. Drives against the long-eared denizens of the plains are conservatively estimated already to have saved enough grass and hay for 6,333 head of cattle or 16,666 sheep. The calculations are based on the contention that eight jackrabbits eat as much as one cow and three times as much as one sheep.

Logan and Bryan Made Defendant In Money Suits

PORTLAND, Ore., Apr. 20 (AP)—Charging that the New York stock brokerage house of Logan and Bryan had knowledge of the precarious financial condition of Overbeck and Cooke, Portland brokerage house now bankrupt, before the local firm's condition was known to others, J. G. Arnold, Portland attorney, today filed two suits in circuit court against Logan and Bryan seeking to recover \$8,322.97 which it was charged was due from securities sold by the defendant company.

The suits were brought in behalf of Arthur M. Welch and A. D. Christensen. Both allege that the securities were left with Overbeck and Cooke as guarantees against any advances made by the brokerage house on the purchase of stock. Both plaintiffs charge that at the time the stocks were converted by Overbeck and Cooke through Logan and Bryan the plaintiffs, owed nothing to Overbeck and Cooke or to Logan and Bryan.

Welch seeks to recover \$6,077.97 and Christensen, \$2,245.

"The Cohens and Kellys in Paris" proves that she is also gifted with

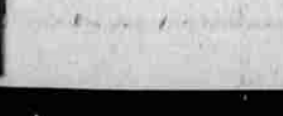
