Railroad Stocks Strong, Active In Wall Street

NEW YORK, Apr. 25 (AP)—Strength and activity of the railroad stocks based on reports of impending favorable developments in the eastern consolidation program overshadowed all other developments in today's stock markets. Violent advances also took place in some of the high priced industrial specialties while the seasonal dividend paying issues showed only moderate gains. Trading was slightly larger volume than yesterday.

The closing was strong. Selling of industrials to purchase the strong railroads caused late reactions of several points in the popular shares such as Radio, General Motors, and Wright Aeronautical. New York and Harlem sold at 43 1/2, a rise of 3/4 this week. Nashville, Chattanooga, and St. Louis and Rocking Valley were newcomers among the strong suits, rising 20 and 37 points respectively. Total sales approximated 2,100,000 shares.

BUTTER AND EGG PRICES STEADY

Poultry Receipts Light—
Asparagus and Rhubarb Selling Cheaply

PORTLAND, Ore., Apr. 25 (AP)—Butter and egg prices were steady and unchanged, and the market was firm today. Yesterday's receipts were 21,678 pounds of butter and 1267 cases of eggs. Storage holdings were: Butter 17, 129 pounds; eggs 34,493 cases.

Poultry receipts have been light the past few days but prices today were steady. Leghorn broilers were plentiful and brought 25 1/2 @ 28c while heavy colored broilers sold around 32c per pound. Supplies of other classes of poultry were only sufficient to meet demand and the market cleaned up early on best quality birds.

Country dressed meats were unchanged in price, with pork still high at 14 1/4 @ 14 1/2c and plentiful and druggery at 17 1/2 @ 18c for the best.

Fresh mint and water cross were in evidence in limited amounts and sold at wholesale at \$1 per dozen. Oregon asparagus and rhubarb are selling as cheaply on local markets as they usually get during the season and the quality is unusually fine. Asparagus was selling at wholesale today around \$1.25 @ 1.40 per dozen and at retail around 15c per pound. Best offerings of rhubarb were going to retailers around \$1 per 35-pound box.

A little Roseburg broccoli is still coming in but supplies are rather normal and prices firm around \$2.25 per crate. The quality is reported good.
