LET CONTRACT ON SNYDER BUILDING

Construction Will Begin Immediately, According to Announcement

Bids for the construction of the Snyder building at 1st and Adams were taken from contractors on Saturday the 28th. Contracts will be entered into with the following contractors today: W. Vedder, of La Grande, was awarded the general contract; Melville's was awarded the contract for the plumbing and heating; Wm. E. Field, Tile company, was awarded the tiling contract; Charles Hilber-

brandt was awarded the roofing contract; J. Melville was awarded the marquette contract; W. H. Bohnenkamp Co. was awarded the elevators.

In awarding the contracts Mrs. Snyder has instructed all contractors that they must use all local materials so far as possible, and must employ all local labor and mechanics in so far as they are capable of performing the work that is set out for them to do, preference to be given first to men with families.

May Add to Building

This building is to be one story in height, but constructed so that at any time the owner wishes they may add two additional stories to the present structure. This building is the first to be started this year in the growing progress of the La Grande business district on Adams avenue. It will be of brick, concrete and precast ornamental concrete trimmings. Imported pressed brick will be placed on the street fronts and trimmed with ornamental precast stone. All store fronts will be of modern construction with full plate glass show windows and plate glass entrances set in copper molding. The bulkheads will be finished on the interior with

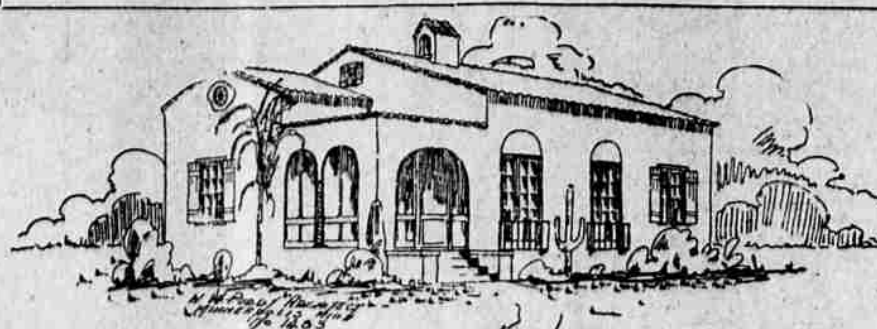
oak and mahogany finish with movable panel backs. The window bases in the street fronts will be finished with tiles in colors. The entrance floors will be tile with the newest floor tile finished with anti-slip finish.

All electrical work within this building will be placed in rigid metal conduit to every outlet in the building, all store rooms will be supplied with steam heat and hot and cold water at all times. Sidewalk elevators and merchandise chutes will be placed in the street sidewalk for servicing the basements of all stores. All plastering will be done in ribbed expanded metal lath, according to Charles Miller, architect.

The contractor, Mr. Vedder, says today that work on the building will begin immediately, and this building will replace the old landmark that has been wrecked the past month by Mr. Hartvigsen, who had the contract for clearing the property.

A FIVE-ROOM SPANISH BUNGALOW

The house wife will find the work reduced to a minimum in this conveniently arranged little bungalow. Entrance is from a small screened-in porch, direct into the living-room. Here the fireplace is the attractive feature. Plaster archway is used as an entrance to the dining-room. The kitchen is conveniently arranged. Two fair-sized bedrooms and bath open off the small center hall. There is a full basement, with the usual laundry, boiler-room and storage space. There is no attic, but windows in each of the gable ends permit a circulation of air, and the ceiling of the main floor is well insulated. The exterior walls are of frame construction, using white cement plaster over metal lath, with red Spanish tile roof, a most permanent material.

The floors throughout are of hardwood, with oak trim in the living and dining rooms, balance in pine to paint. Plaster walls are of rough texture tinted, with iron lighting fixtures.

While the white is the most popular cutting variety the colored types are most valued for their fine effect in the garden. Of these, rose cardinal is the most brilliant rosy red.
