Strangler Lewis Defeats Lutze In Finish Match

LOS ANGELES, May 3 (AP)—The resourcefulness and presence of mind acquired by Ed "Strangler" Lewis, world's heavyweight wrestling champion, in his many years of grappling with the top-notchers of the wrestling game today had stood him in good stead again.

Facing young and powerful Nick Lutze here last night in a finish match, Lewis literally crushed the championship aspirations of the former Notre Dame football star after his, the title holder, had been on the defensive throughout the early part of the match...

Finally, after one hour 29 minutes and 35 seconds of give and take Lutze again secured his body constricting scissors. Lewis, seeing a sudden opening, grasped young Nick by head and feet, stood up and then, before anyone knew what was happening, felt heavily with Lutze underneath. Lewis' 230 pounds, employed as they were, proved entirely too much for his opponent and the latter was carried from the ring unconscious and bleeding.

Later examinations by physicians showed Lutze had been badly shaken up and out over the right eye but not seriously hurt.

MISS WALTON SELECTED BY THE GOVERNOR

SALEM, Ore., May 3 (AP)—Miss Bernice Walton of Salem, has been appointed by Governor Patterson as his private secretary. She succeeds Hal C. Ross of Oregon City, who resigned March 1 to give his attention to his candidacy for the republican nomination for secretary of state.

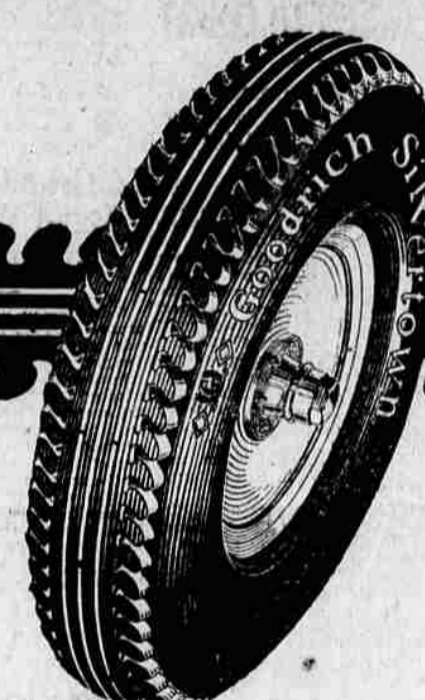
