IMMIGRATION POLICY IS NOT LIKED BY M. E.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., May 7 (AP)—The immigration policy of the United States as regards exclusion was assailed and the admission of all nationals on a quota basis was urged in a resolution adopted by the quadrennial general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church here today.
The resolution, presented by Dr. E. Stanley Jones, missionary to India, gave hearty approval to the restriction of immigration but condemned the exclusion of some nationalities as an "insidious, un-American and un-Christian policy."
It asked all Christian citizens to unite in removing, as soon as possible, such "as restricts immigration and the right of citizenship on the ground of race and color."
A conference was held in the midst of its business session for a special prayer for war-torn China.

Miss Taylor, it is said, was selected from thousands of candidates, and after seeing her remarkable performance there will be no doubt that her choice was a happy one. 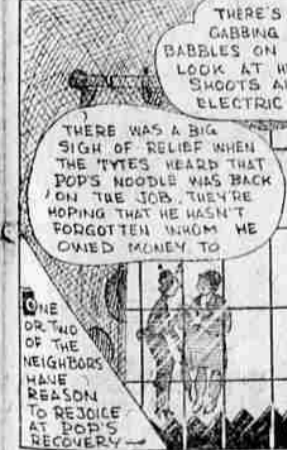

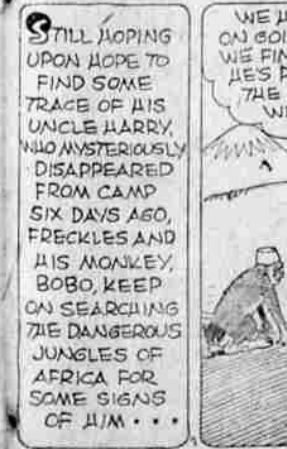
